Inspirational Quotes From Christian Meditation Network

We cannot force the pace of meditation or speed up the natural progress of our prayer. If we think about these things we are not meditating! We are thinking about ourselves and putting ourselves first. Meditation needs simplicity. We begin and continue saying the mantra. Sit with a straight spine. Breathe in and out, deeply, to begin. Gently move into a rhythm of breathing. Say in your heart: *Ma-ra-na-tha*.
