The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Year C

As if the Church were not satisfied with fifty days of paschal feasting, the festivals continue beyond the season. First the Holy Trinity is honoured, and now the Body and Blood of Christ.

Today's observance originated in the Belgian city of Liége in the 13th century. Very soon after, in 1264, Pope Urban IV decreed that the feast be celebrated by the whole Western Church. From its beginnings through to the reforms of the Second Vatican Council, the popular focus of the feast was on the presence of Christ in the consecrated bread, the Blessed Sacrament. This narrow understanding is still reflected in the fact that many still call the feast by its original Latin name, Corpus Christi.

Today the word of God focuses on the eucharist as a meal that reveals God's saving work for us in Jesus. By our communion in the Body and Blood of Christ we enter into the mystery of Jesus' self-gift to us in shared food and drink. The eucharist is not a sacred object but first and foremost an action that engages us personally and socially. It calls us to break the bread and pour out the wine of our lives for the sake of the world.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL WINTER APPEAL 22ND AND 23RD JUNE

The Parish Vinnies Winter Appeal will be held on the weekend of 22nd and 23rd June. Second collection donations in June will be included in the Appeal.

The Parish has supported Vinnies activities in the inner suburbs for many years. This year we would like to assist the Vinnies Soup Vans in their work of providing soup, hot food, sandwiches, fruit, etc to around 5,000 needy people each week on the streets, in boarding houses and in social housing in inner suburbs and regional areas. Importantly, the Vinnies maintain regular social connections with all those they meet.

The Vinnies Vere Street, Collingwood store, which provides food to several hundred needy people each month, also distributes clothing when available. If you have winter coats (men's, women's or children's) that you no longer need, you could leave them on Appeal Day and they will be delivered to the Vere Street store. Good quality shoes that you no longer need can also be left on Appeal Day.

The St Clement's Bulleen Conference of St Vincent de Paul responds to calls for assistance within St Kevin's Parish, because we do not have a local Conference. Each year we donate about \$800 from this Appeal to support them. If you would like to join the St Clement's Conference you would be most welcome.

The memory of Jesus feeding the crowd must have been treasured in the early Christian community. There are 2 stories of such an event in Matthew and Mark, and one each in Luke and John. Thus, as well as being told 6 times, it is the only miracle common to all 4 gospels.
