Living the Gospel – Trinity Every time we make the sign of the cross we reaffirm our belief in a God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Although some people have difficulties with the gender-specific language of 'Father' and 'Son' and look for other ways to express this reality, all Christian people profess a belief in the one God who is experienced in three distinct ways. We are baptised 'in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit' and we remind ourselves of this reality when we pray and when we bless ourselves or others.

Questions for Adults

- Q. Why do some people accuse Christians of worshipping three Gods, not one?
- Q. In what ways do you find three different expressions of God to be helpful?
- Q. What did Jesus mean by saying that the Spirit 'will not be speaking as from himself'?
- Q. Why do many people attribute a feminine quality to the Holy Spirit?
- Q. How would you describe your understanding of the Trinity?

We Care – Responding to the Voluntary Assisted Dying Act Pope Francis has encouraged ordinary Catholics everywhere to resist euthanasia and to protect the old, the young and the vulnerable from being cast aside in a "throw-away culture". We are called to follow Christ by accompanying people with compassion, sharing hope not fear. The Bishops of the Catholic dioceses of Melbourne, Ballarat, Sale and Sandhurst, echoing Pope Francis, have published a pastoral letter including practical guidance on ways we can be conscientious objectors to euthanasia. ST VINCENT DE PAUL WINTER APPEAL 22ND AND 23RD JUNE

The Parish Vinnies Winter Appeal will be held on the weekend of 22nd and 23rd June. Second collection donations in June will be included in the Appeal.

The Parish has supported Vinnies activities in the inner suburbs for many years. This year we would like to assist the Vinnies Soup Vans in their work of providing soup, hot food, sandwiches, fruit, etc to around 5,000 needy people each week on the streets, in boarding houses and in social housing in inner suburbs and regional areas. Importantly, the Vinnies maintain regular social connections with all those they meet.

The Vinnies Vere Street, Collingwood store, which provides food to several hundred needy people each month, also distributes clothing when available. If you have winter coats (men's, women's or children's) that you no longer need, you could leave them on Appeal Day and they will be delivered to the Vere Street store. Good quality shoes that you no longer need can also be left on Appeal Day.

The St Clement's Bulleen Conference of St Vincent de Paul responds to calls for assistance within St Kevin's Parish, because we do not have a local Conference. Each year we donate about \$800 from this Appeal to support them. If you would like to join the St Clement's Conference you would be most welcome.
