Historical Context – Stone for bread

The stone/bread, snake/fish and scorpion/egg comparisons seem a little far fetched to us, but would have made perfect sense to a 1st Century Palestinian audience. The flat, brown stones around Lake Galilee look very similar to the flat bread that was baked in the area. The 'snake' may refer to a sea-snake – an eel – which might be caught up in a fisherman's nets but was regarded as unclean by the Jews. The poisonous scorpions of the region are very pale in colour and when curled up at rest could be mistaken for an egg.

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's unlikely that the name Anicia Faltonia Proba is familiar to many churchgoers. A wealthy Roman noblewoman, she fled to Africa in the year 410. Two years later, the great St Augustine wrote her a letter (#130) on the subject of prayer. It may be his most well-known letter. Along with other teaching Augustine commented on the Lord's Prayer. Here are a few snippets.

"We need words to help us recollect ourselves and see what we are asking for, not to make us support that the Lord must be given information or swayed by words".

"When we say, 'Thy kingdom come,' which will certainly come whether we wish it or not, we arouse our desire for that kingdom, that it may come for us..." .

"When we say, 'Give us this day our daily bread,' we mean by 'today' this present time. We are asking either for sufficiency ... or for the sacrament of believers".

These are just tiny tidbits. The whole letter offers much more food for thought, it's worth reading in full.
