SOCIAL JUSTICE @ ST KEVIN'S

During August the second collection will go towards the fight against **Human Trafficking.** In the words of Pope Benedict, human trafficking is a "crime against humanity" and a form of

slavery which is "unfortunately increasingly widespread, which involves every country, even the most developed, and touches the most vulnerable people in society: women and young girls, children,

the disabled, the most poor, whoever comes from situations of familial or social disintegration."

In 2019, there are 21 million human victims worldwide.

Trafficking happens by coercion, force and deception for sex slavery and labour slavery. The feast of the Assumption, like all Marian feasts, says more about Jesus than it does about Mary. Marian feasts are fundamentally christological, expressing something foundational about Christ and the power of the incarnation and resurrection. With respect to the assumption, the Church has long maintained, at least since the fourth century, a belief that Mary was taken up to heaven after her earthly life. The Eastern Church typically refers to this as the dormition (or sleeping) of Mary, expressing the belief that she did not die but slept, and then was taken up to heaven. The Roman Catholic Church refers to this as the assumption. Whether or not Mary actually died has never been dogmatically defined. However, in an act of papal infallibility, Pope Pius XXII dogmatically proclaimed the assumption as a matter of faith in 1950. It might seem odd that nineteen hundred years after the assumption it was proclaimed dogmatically, but again, it says more about Christ than about Mary. Ultimately, it is the power of Christ and his resurrection that prevented Mary's body from seeing decay.

Our Needlecraft Volunteers are putting a call-out for knitted/crocheted squares which are then sewn together to produce blankets for the needy in our community.
