Plenary Council

Last Saturday, 10th August a group of parishioners attended a diocesan meeting about the next phase of preparation for the Plenary Council.

The next phase involves prayerful processes of group discernment about how we all can implement the themes identified in the first phase, both locally and nationally.

That is, how can the Catholic Church community – both locally and nationally - be:

- A missionary and evangelising community
- A community that is inclusive, participatory and synodal
- A community that is humble, healing and merciful
- A prayerful and eucharistic community
- A joyful, hope-filled and servant community
- A community open to conversion, renewal and reform.

By way of introduction, Fr Kevin Lenehan, from Catholic Theological College, described how the Church, from its very beginning, has had to deal with deep division as new issues and situations arose.

Ms Lana Turvey-Collins, from the Plenary Council Facilitation Team, described the process of prayerful communal discernment a suggested guide for local communities to use.

In the coming weeks and months, through to March next year there will be invitations to join in group discernment (not debate) about how to be the church described above – and through this process to act locally and to provide suggestions for national writing groups.
