Sustainability - Stop Flushing Wet Wipes A major problem currently exists regarding the suitability of wet wipes to be flushed down the toilet. Unfortunately, a huge oversight in packaging laws means companies can advertise their wet wipes as being "flushable" simply because they will disappear when flushed, without taking into account the long- term repercussions of the product on plumbing systems. In February, a one-tonne cluster of wet wipes blew out a pumping station near Lake Macquarie, requiring specialised equipment to remove the blockage. 300 kilograms had to be removed by hand, one bucket at a time. And that's at just one council. In short, wet wipes should not be flushed under any circumstances. If you must use, put it in the bin.
