#### The First Sunday of Advent

The Advent season begins where Ordinary Time left off – with the coming of Christ at the end of time. Paul and Matthew issue an urgent call for us to be vigilant, to be awake and ready for the day of the Lord. The note of warning in their message is counter-balanced by the vision of the prophet Isaiah. He foresees a time of peace, a world illuminated by the light of the Lord. This work of the Lord is something to rejoice in, as the psalm makes clear. The call to watch out for the coming of the Lord may seem like a threat, but is meant to challenge us to be fully alive in the here and now. The mission of Jesus was to set us free, not to leave us imprisoned in fear or anxiety. "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full" (John 10: 10). We are always at risk of becoming obsessed with our needs and wants, blinded by the 'way things are', weighed down by our struggles and limitations. This first Sunday of Advent summons us into a world of grace, to lift up our heads, open our eyes, and see the work of God around us.

#### **Some More Advent Thoughts...**

What are the waiting moments that you experience? How can our St Kevin's community accompany you? "Let us rethink our usual way of doing things; let us open our eyes and ears and above all our hearts, so as not to be complacent about things as they are but unsettled by the living and effective Word".
