External Context

- •A region under siege
- •Israel historically a nation under oppression
- •Jewish Roman crisis leads to the great Jewish diaspora
- •Matthew's community are likely to be in a major city with others from the Jewish diaspora, confronting influences from other religions
- •Encounter social issues relating to wealth, power, culture and immorality

Matthew's Community

- •Gospel written during a period of expansion for Christians
- The Second Coming of Jesus no longer seen as imminent
- •The threat of total persecution has passed but external tensions exist between Christians and their Jewish and Gentile neighbours
- •Community made up largely of converts from Judaism
- Growing separation and distinctive identity from other Jews.
