Breaking Of The Bread By reason of the sign, the material for the Eucharistic Celebration must truly have the appearance of food. It is desirable that the Eucharistic bread, even though unleavened and made in the traditional form, be fashioned in such a way that the priest at Mass with the people is truly able to break it into parts and distribute these to at least some of the faithful... The gesture of the fraction or breaking of bread, which was quite simply the term by which the Eucharist was known in apostolic times, will bring out more clearly the force and importance of the sign of the unity of all in the one bread... GIRM 321

Have you thought? – The role of the observer In today's gospel passage, it is the devout Simeon and the prophetess, Anna, who declare the greatness and farreaching influence of the child that has been brought to the Temple. This is a common feature of the gospel accounts. It is not Jesus himself who proclaims his greatness but those who have observed him and recognised the revelation of God's presence amongst the people. It is a role that continues today. Those of us who believe and recognise the presence and influence of God in the world are challenged to proclaim it in both our actions and our words.

- Q. How might Simeon's predictions about their child have affected Joseph and Mary?
- Q. Why did the first-born son hold such a special place in ancient times?
- Q. In what ways do people 'offer their lives to God' today?
- Q. In what ways can you be like Simeon and Anna and proclaim the importance of Jesus?
