

And so we start the first (and shortest Gospel) Mark.

Let us drink this in together! We shall have a discussion/study group next year depending on interest.

Reconciliation - First Saturday of the month @ 10.00am (or by appointment)

Christian Meditation - Wednesdays @ 9.30am in the Parish Chapel

Mark's Gospel divides naturally into two parts. At the centre in Chapter eight there is Jesus' question: Who do you say I am?, followed by Peter's affirmation: You are the Christ, and Jesus' teaching about suffering. Before Chapter eight there is the public ministry of Jesus in Galilee. In this first part of the Gospel Mark shows how there is no one who understands who Jesus is. The people, his own family and friends, and the religious authorities, all fail to understand. Finally, in Chapter eight, Peter expresses the truth: You are the Messiah. But then the rest of the Gospel explains what kind of Messiah Jesus is – he is a suffering Messiah. Three passion predictions (8: 31, 9: 31, 10: 33) are accompanied by intense teaching on discipleship. They lead to the real focus of the Gospel, the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus.

Mark, then, was a writer who effectively shaped his material in order to communicate his theology. There is a starkness about his presentation which is appropriate in the light of his concern for the suffering Messiah. He presents a vivid picture, however, which has many observations of detail which the later writers tend to omit. He stresses the humanity of Jesus by showing him to have strong feelings (see, eg 3: 5; 10: 14; 14: 36). This first Gospel portrait of Jesus is one to which we can easily relate.
