### St Kevin's Parish Discussions

Since last Wednesday week's marvellous attendance (150 + 14 apologies) the Parish Pastoral Council and the "Lay Leader Committee" have met and are determined to keep up the momentum you have achieved.

The following may clarify our questions:

- 1. Lay ecclesial leader. It is proposed the Archdiocese would appoint, in consultation with the parish, a suitably qualified and experienced lay person to coordinate pastoral case within the parish, and to manage the activities of the parish subject to the oversight of the moderator of pastoral care.
- 2. Moderator of pastoral care. The Archdiocese would appoint a priest as moderator of pastoral care. This priest would have the powers and functions of a priest, but not be the parish priest of St Kevin's. He would provide oversight and mentoring to the lay ecclesial leader.
- 3. A panel of retired priests. The parish would identify a panel of retired priests who agree to say Mass and to provide other priestly services to St Kevin's on an occasional but continuing basis.
- 4. Preserving the role of priest and laity. It is envisaged that the lay leader would be appointed under the current provisions of Canon Law (can. 517 §2). The parish recognises the need to respect the appropriate roles of priests and laity as they're defined.

The Parish Pastoral Council is drafting a submission to go to the Archbishop.

I shall talk to the Vicar General – with a general question of how he sees us best going forward.
