This year the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council have adopted the NAIDOC theme for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday – **Heal Country.** Today's Gospel is very fitting because Mark tells us of Jesus returning to his 'native place' -Nazareth – to a non-accepting hostile reaction. In Australia, our own First Nations people have suffered a similar reception to Jesus in Nazareth. 2021 marks the 250th Anniversary of the arrival of Christianity in Australia. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples are inextricably connected to country in Australia and its waters. For Catholics, the Eucharist itself is a foundational sacramental reality in which natural elements – grain and grapes – symbolise not only our lives but also Jesus' farewell meal and his presence today. Because of the connection that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people recognise between country, faith and wellbeing, it is no surprise that when the world is in pain, Australia's First Peoples are in pain. On this special Sunday, a day where Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and non-indigenous Catholics come together and sit side by side, we should acknowledge that we are united in a fight to save God's creation. Again, today's Gospel also speaks of the need for faith and acceptance to enable gifts to be shared. The more we share with each other, the more we realise that as humans, we have more similarities than differences. Let us move forwards as a united people in Christ, committed to embracing the gifts of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander knowledge to not only Heal Country, but to Heal our relationships with one another, and in doing so our creators' gifts to us all – this world.

Inspirational Quotes From Christian Meditation Network


