
Living the Gospel - Truth

Synod 2021-2023



In dioceses around the world, a period of consultation continues as part of a process culminating in the Synod of Bishops gathering in Rome in October 2023. From the PP's Desk... ChildSafe Self-Assessment Tool

On Tuesday evening I spent two hours with a wonderful and energetic small group at St Gregory's, poring over the "ChildSafe Self-Assessment Tool" to assess our progress in relation to meeting the standards required for full compliance. Congratulations to the parish for how well you are progressing, though there is much left to do. I haven't had a similar discussion yet with the St Kevin's committee, though I understand you are at a similar level of progress and therefore also deserving congratulations.

One thread that came up over and over again in the discussions of the array of standards and how to progress with them and implement them was 'culture.'

A few people have questioned me over the past few years "I'm a good granddad why do I need a Working with Children Check, don't you trust me?" Yes, of course I trust you! But! It is not the reason for the standards and mandated expectations: they come from seeking to build a culture across our entire parish with all its groups: a culture which grows to reach a level of at least conscious competence in thinking about every situation from the perspective of the children we love: what about this situation, the picnic, these carols, do we see that could endanger them. We can only develop this culture if we start with ourselves: how can others be sure I am ok with children? Get to know me –sure. And show them that I have no record of harming others (that's what a WWCC starts to provide).

We know the past contains terrible wrongs in our church, and much of that wrongness can be sheeted home to poor leadership and diabolical individuals causing harm. We realise today of course that each and every one of us has a role to play in demonstrating that we have a safe culture for our children. We've come a long way, thank you again. Let's, together, keep journeying in a positive/constructive way towards an even better culture arising from the love of Jesus Christ who inspires us. Are you willing to offer some time to help? Call Fr Charles at the office.
