From the PP's Desk... Listening

This past week has been busy in all sorts of ways!

Suddenly, after months of no calls at all, I was called out three times this week to visit someone approaching death and celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick with them. What a grace! And I learned once again the importance of listening. It can be so hard to let go of my thoughts about how anointing is administered and to open myself to hearing the needs of the person and the family. So often the actions for administration of the sacrament are dwarfed by the moment: a moment of vulnerability where people reveal their fears about sickness and death.

I met with five delightful children from St Greg's 6th Grade: altar servers. I had asked to have them walk me through what they do and how they do it and when during Mass. The ministry of altar server varies quite remarkably from parish to parish and priest to priest. They came to the church and together they knew exactly how everything is done: top marks to them all after such a long stint away from actually doing their ministry. By listening closely I was able to get a crystal clear insight into their ministry and also begin to identify a few of my own preferences and they learned a thing or two as well.

We had a funeral (at St Kevin's) and I learned a little more about how to let people do their job. In Meredith, I got everything ready – which is lovely and I didn't have anyone to delegate to so that was the way to go. By listening to them I learned more about working as a team.

This thing that is listening is a vital skill. St Benedict says we have to put aside our desires and plans and needs and listen openly. We must open ourselves, be vulnerable, then we may actually hear the person speaking in a deep way that goes far beyond the physical and mental processes and reaches into the spiritual depths.

I am seeking even more than I usually do to listen before speaking as I grow to know you, the people who are the parish: seeking to listen deeply for the needs of the parish, listen deeply for God's Word guiding me. We will all need to be open to listening. It is listening in this deep way which is what Pope Francis sees as being core to the way the Catholic Church will grow in today's life.

This type of listening at the heart of is what is named Dadirri by our First Peoples and especially by Miriam Rose Ungunnmerr-Baumann. Becoming still, deeply still. Making time and space. Allowing the Creator space and time to enter into you. Learning from the listening: learning about God's direction, God's call.

We will need this listening as we journey into a future that somehow fulfils our call to be even more a people who go forth and make disciples. God Bless, Fr Charles
