#### From the PP's Desk...

#### Synod on Synodality: Communion, Participation, Mission

Synod comes from two Greek words meaning 'together' and 'way' – this term is relatively new to me, and I think to all of us. It is a term that has been around as something distant – something Bishops do in Rome perhaps. One of the most interesting things about this synod is that Pope Francis desires that the process of preparing for the Synod becomes a lived example of living as a synodal church: the form of the consultations that have started and that we will undertake is the form that journeying together should have if we are to be the Church the Spirit calls us to be in this world in which we live.

Pope Francis has asked that we all become involved in preparing for this new synodal process. The consultation process is open now and extends until late February 2022. You can get much background at <a href="https://melbournecatholic.org/synodality">https://melbournecatholic.org/synodality</a>. You can get material to help you prepare a personal submission or to help you organise group discussions and submissions. Each submission is limited to 250 words.

We are planning that we will journey together with consultation sessions across each parish though the form/timing of these has not been set yet. Our submissions get aggregated across the archdiocese and state and added to the nation and sent in to the Synod organisers.

#### **Advent and Christmas**

The journey into Advent and Christmas this year is quite different for me. For the first time I must spread myself across parishes and organise supply to fill the gaps where I can't be. Till now in my ministry, despite the presence of many places of worship in Meredith Parish, I was able to be present for each community and celebrate all the Masses for the parish (both at Christmas and at Easter). This year I must be present across two separate parishes with communities large enough to require multiple Masses so I can't be as present for all, as I wish.

In addition, I have not been able to get myself fully familiar with both parishes so some things that got organised in the past may get omitted – it may not too late though: if there are elements of Advent or Christmas you feel may not be being arranged – come forwards, let me know and we'll see what can be done.

One thing that will be different will be inviting both parishes to attend the Advent Reconciliation Service in one location: St Kevin's, 16<sup>th</sup> December at 7.30pm. I think this will give a marvellous sense of energy to a beautiful reflective evening and it means two events do not need arranging.
