#### From the PP's Desk...

**War! Pease!** There is a series of young adult books called "The Hunger Games" - well on through the books the central character, Katniss, says she is sick of being Snow's slave, of being manipulated into killing people by Snow, the evil dictator. Katniss chooses at that moment to respond to violence with peace/forgiveness, to turn away a threat through solidarity. Later, she fails in her aspiration: she does participate in (much) further violence. But! Her action points, perhaps not intentionally, to a key facet of Jesus Christ: he is always, always, always willing to suffer rather than respond with violence (the cleansing of the temple is an exception to prove the rule).

Violence is never the way to achieve the peace Jesus Christ desires so ardently to impart upon us. Perhaps we can impart to our Lenten prayers and actions a particularly care towards bring bringers of peace, Christ's peace to every aspect of our lives.

#### Lent / Easter:

The beginning of Lent has been special and different this year. Special because our preparation for Easter is not overshadowed by lockdowns—we are (largely) free to plan our Lent and our Easter as we want it to be. Different because, for me, this is the first time were the presence of children is strongly in their favour: children far outnumbering adults across all five Ash Wednesday services. Their enthusiasm, openness, honesty is a moment of grace for me, grace from the Holy Spirit.

Do you have your Lenten disciplines in place and in action? Allow them to form and develop under the influence of the Holy Spirit—calling you to start something new this year. Imagine something new, something 'out of the box' - perhaps ... making an extra effort each day to approach someone you've seen often but never spoken to.

Our scripture readings during Lent continually speak to us about doing things which will change our hearts. "Create a new heart in me of Lord ..."

Perhaps this year we can make this wish just a little more real.





# St Kevin's Parish Submission "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission"

In March 2020, Pope Francis announced that the theme for the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in October 2023 would be "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission". Synodality means 'walking together on a path'. We are walking together as a parish and together with other Catholics in Australia and around the world to discern and find a way forward. Pope Francis has invited all Catholics to take part in this consultation process which happens at a diocesan level.

A working group from our parish has prepared a draft submission for the Archdiocese. The Archdiocese will then make a submission to the Synod of Bishops.

In Australia the process of 'walking together' has already begun with the Plenary Council. Our draft submission relies on the hard work we did in preparation for the Plenary Council meetings.
