From the PP's Desk...

Breakthrough

I've been spending time with Tiziana and Rebecca and the Parish Council looking at the parish and how we can come out of Covid-19-effects (yes we are still coming out, attendance at Mass / involvement in parish things look to be at about 60% of what they were pre-Covid-19.

At the same time we are looking to find ways forward so that the parish can thrive and grow as a parish of missionary disciples. To engage more fully with the community we are updating our website and we will have a regular presence on social media.

I have said it before, but if we are to respond to Jesus' call, it is not possible that we stay as we are. We must seek to be well formed disciples, supporting each other. Disciples who are willing to look outwards and forwards.

To this end I am wondering what "Breakthrough" ideas would either improve our current situation greatly or provide ways in which we can become a parish which has an attitude of mind, heart and action which seeks to invite people to come to know Jesus Christ.

It is really hard to come up with "Breakthrough" areas. A couple I felt might be appropriate are:

- Grow our music ministry to be even more alive and engaging across a broader swath of people.
- Grow our welcoming to go beyond "hello" and a cuppa after 10 am Mass grow welcoming to be the start of a journey with people.

Then I find it gets more difficult—and even those two are easy to say but hard to do in a substantial way. And getting results implies bringing in new volunteers.

One important thing restarting is a Social Justice Group – John Costa has stepped up to seek to make this a reality.

First Reading

Acts 14: 21-27

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them.

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.
