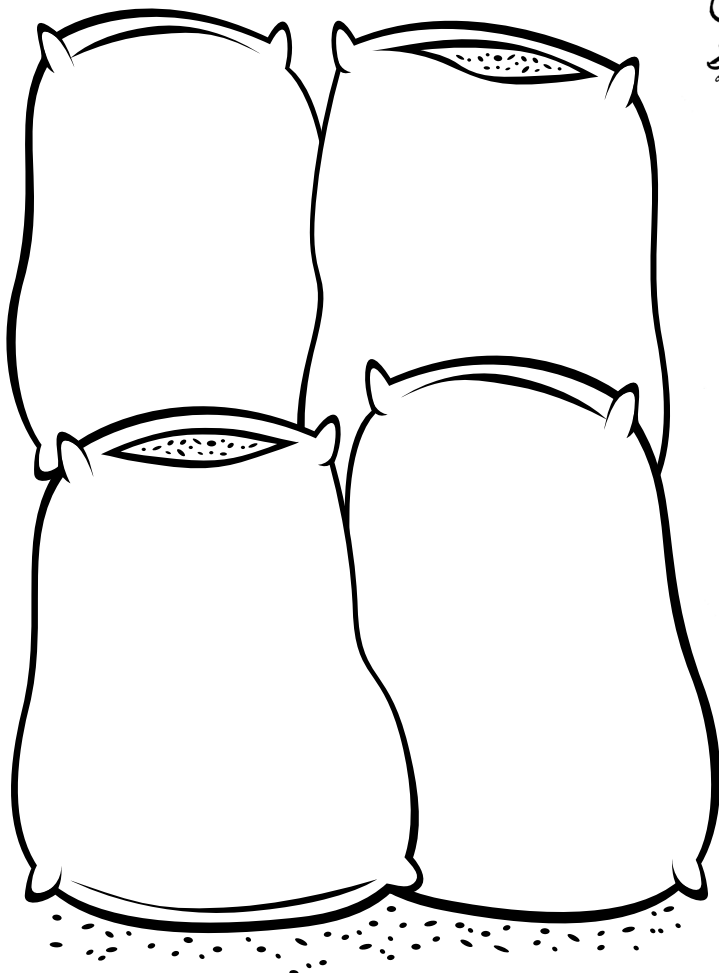
Gospel Luke 12:13-21

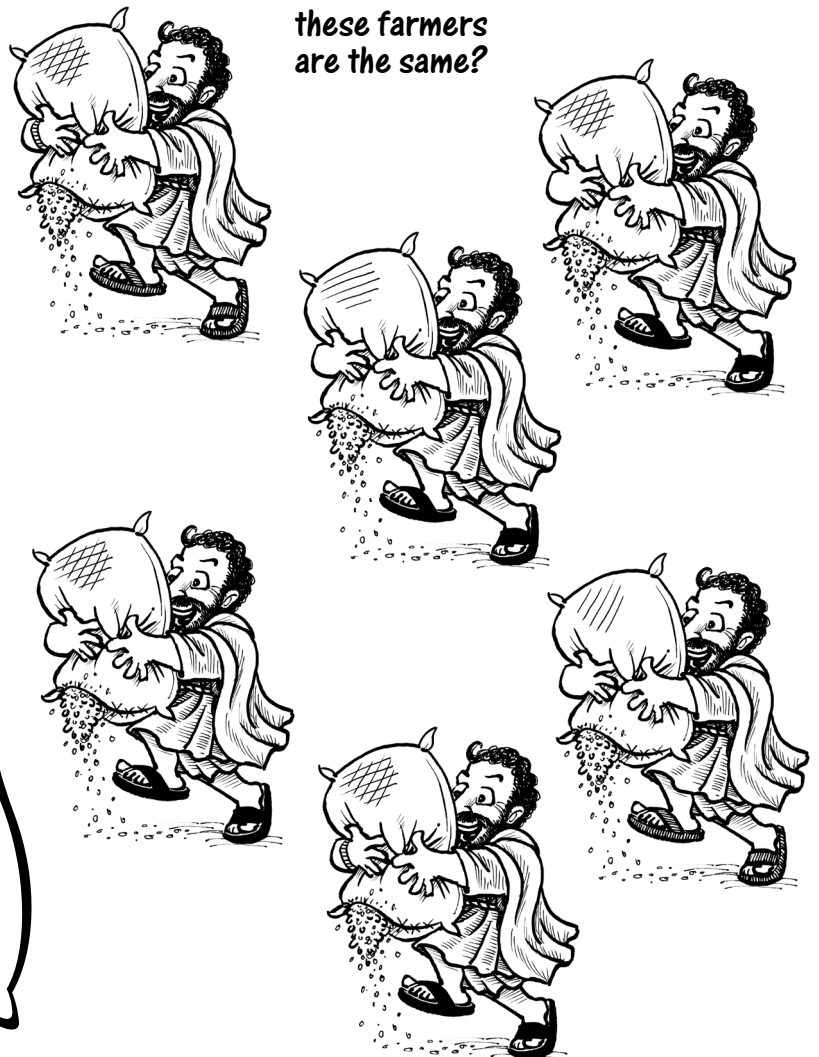

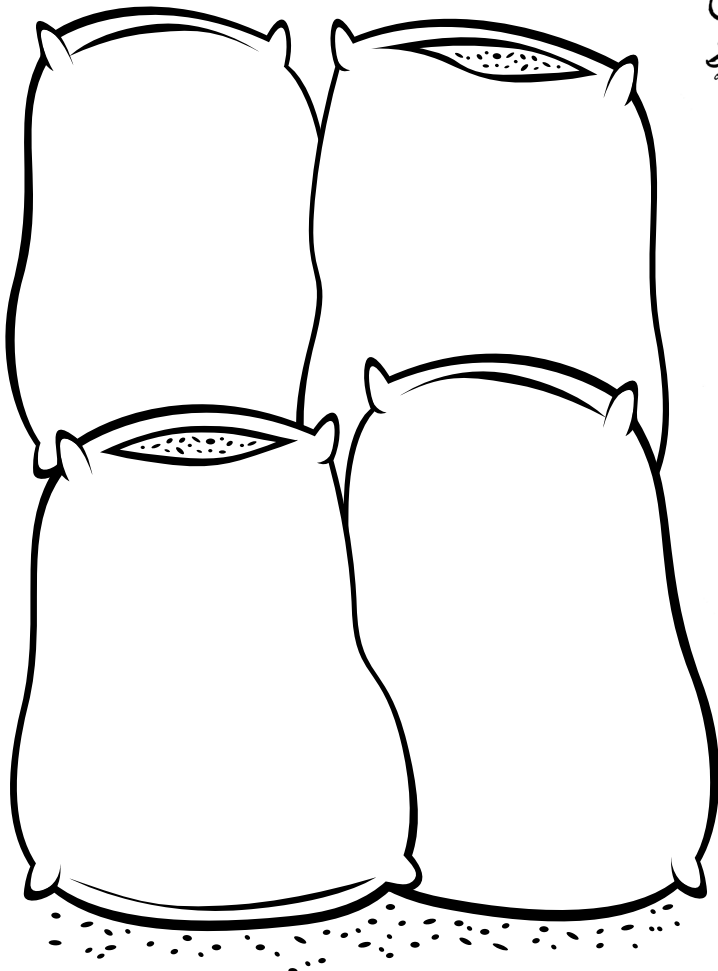
