A few thoughts from the desk of the PP...

Archbishop Peter has issued a letter titled "Welcome Home" (a copy of which is on the noticeboard in the Gathering Space). We are once again obliged to attend Mass each Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation. At the start of the Covid-19 pandemic, he provided us all a dispensation from this Obligation (though we still desired to attend). This dispensation has been ended from the 1st Sunday of Advent. In lifting this dispensation Archbishop Peter comments "the ordinary individual exemptions will remain in place (eg for reasons of ill health, family care of the vulnerable, etc). So, as has always been the case, you must take proper consideration of your personal circumstances when deciding to participate in our gathering for Mass. Whilst gathering for Mass is a vital element of living our being as Catholics, our desire and obligation to attend Mass must not be at risk to our health or the health of others.

From this weekend, I am no longer going to live-stream Masses. Our full return to Mass, the rapid decline in numbers viewing live-streamed Masses, an extensive discussion among the Safeguarding Committee about the risks of having our children visible on line, and ongoing technical difficulties with live-streaming mean that the need for making Mass available no longer outweigh the risks associated. If this change causes you any issues, please contact the office (phone, email).

Another decision that arose from our Safeguarding Committee meeting is to prohibit photography during Masses due to the risks associated with children being visible on social media. If there are baptisms or people receiving sacraments then photographs can be taken after Mass instead of during. This emphasises the importance and solemnity of the Mass and at the same time helps us to develop and embed our culture of conscious care for and safe-guarding of our children and other vulnerable people.

ADVENT/CHRISTMAS

Wow – this weekend we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King and next week Advent begins and we enter a new liturgical year: Year A, a year focussing through the Gospel of Matthew.

We have settled on the schedule of Masses for Christmas. See it elsewhere in this newsletter. On December 15th here at St Kevin's Church, there will be a Joint Parishes Rite of Reconciliation, with personal, individual, absolution available after the body of the service. We will start the service at 7.00pm (there is plenty of parking behind St Kevin's Church as well as along the road, and you can drop off those with mobility constraints at the front door before parking).

This week we went through the final week of "Ordinary Time" of the liturgical year, beginning with the Feast of Christ the King (the king who dies ignominiously through crucifixion). Let us allow this contradiction to rest with us: a King and such a lowly, terrible death – and that leads to our salvation, and a world that grows in goodness (slowly, imperfectly). Perhaps ... in our weakness and in our times of great difficulty, the opportunity for us to bear witness to God's great love is most evident.







REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

First Reading Second Reading

2 Samuel 5: 1-3

The two stories of David's royal anointing – first as king of the southern kingdom of Judah, then as king of the northern kingdom of Israel – are deceptively short and innocent. One has to read much more than these few verses to discover that David did not arrive at these positions of power by accident. Ambition, intrigue, rivalry, betrayals and assassinations all played their part in the story. They testify to the suspicion with which the prophets viewed the institution of monarchy and to their critique of its failures.

Nonetheless David became revered as shepherd-king and as the founder of an eternal dynasty. It was a measure of David's pre-eminence that the northern tribes and elders made their way south to Hebron to petition him to be their king.

In Jesus' day, the long-awaited messiah was to be a "son of David." Right from the start Matthew announces Jesus Christ as "the son of David, the son of Abraham". Other New Testament writers use the title too. Christians will tune in to the promise that David would be "shepherd of my people Israel," even though the gospel for today's feast is not one that refers to Jesus as the good shepherd.

Colossians 1: 12-20

Late in the letter to the Colossians, the author (whether Paul himself or a later writer invoking his name) speaks of being chained up in prison. This reference to painful confinement in what we could presume was a dark and depressing cell makes the cosmic vision of today's reading all the more remarkable. Prefacing the poem that acclaims the allembracing all-pervasive power of Christ, the author celebrates the light and freedom won for us by the Son of God.

The poem itself, perhaps a pre-existing liturgical hymn, falls into two parts. The first extols Christ as the governing principle of the whole of creation, the second as the redeemer in whom all things are reconciled. The first draws on both the Jewish tradition of wisdom as God's agent in creation and on strands of Greek philosophical thought. The second offers wisdom of a very different kind, the wisdom that Paul described as "God's foolishness," that of the crucified Christ, an obstacle for Jews and madness for pagans but one who was "the power and wisdom of God".

If there was a risk that the initial vision of Christ and creation might be dismissed as idealised, this is countered by the realism of the concluding reference to his "death on the cross" (more literally, "the blood of his cross"), paving the way for the gospel text that follows.

This is a sublime confession of faith.
