It has always been our family tradition to set up a nativity scene at home during Advent. First Sunday of Advent

In Italian, the nativity scene is called 'presepio'. There is an art to making a presepio - it is a detailed reproduction of Bethlehem and the manger. It takes time, planning and creativity.

There are a lot of things we no longer do as a family as the children grow, but so far, the presepio has endured. We are often ships in the night, but we make time for this on the first weekend of Advent. We plan, we design, we unpack the figurines, (we occasionally argue!) and we set to work. Every year, the presepio is slightly different from the year before. We bring to it something of ourselves, what we have learnt along the way. We see it as an act of service and devotion, preparation and welcome.

Finding a time when the five of us are free is challenging. It would be much easier not to do it. Advent is such a busy time of the year. We are busy, tired and really isn't everyone just waiting to get to the FINISH line - Christmas Day?


It is not easy to push back against the frenzy of this time of year to make space for reflection and prayer. It is counter-cultural to live simply and slowly in our complex modern world.

In a podcast I heard recently, I was reminded that it must have been very busy around the time of Jesus' birth too. It was Census time, and everyone was out and about to be counted. In fact, it was so crowded that there was no room at the inn. That there was no room at the inn, did not stop God. God came anyway.

In the busyness and complexity of modern life, it seems there's no room at the inn - but God is being born in every moment, God finds a way. I'm not sure how, when or where. Perhaps, it is best not to have preconceived ideas of how God comes in. Let's be open to moments of encounter with the divine in ourselves and others by embracing simplicity of heart and humility when we can.

For my family, it's the presepio. For you?







REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT				
First Reading	Second Reading			
Isaiah 2: 1-5	<u>1 Romans 13: 11-14</u>			
The very first reading of the season is a glorious vision of universal peace. The prophet Isaiah depicts the hill- top city of Jerusalem as the earthly counterpart of the heavenly mount from which God reigns. All the peoples of the earth will flock there; everyone will learn and follow the ways of the Lord; war will end and peace will prevail. With this oracle we have the opportunity to establish a strong spirit of Advent hope at the outset of the season. It is a powerful declaration, full of confidence and conviction. It has a high poetic character that needs to be respected and not rushed through or reduced to matter-of-fact recitation. Each element of the oracle should be allowed its role in depicting the scene. The vision proper is divided into two parts by the direct speech of the people.	After Isaiah's inspirational vision of universal peace, complemented by the responsorial psalm, the second reading delivers what may be felt as a short, sharp shock. The brief excerpt from the final chapters of Paul's lengthy treatise on salvation, his letter to the Romans, offer a blunt warning. Time is short, the works of darkness must be abandoned, and the way of light chosen. The key image at play is the elemental contrast between night and day. Paul expands on this by naming behaviours, whether of the flesh or of the mind, that shy away from exposure to the light. He doesn't offer a counter-list of the "works of day". It's worth noting that most translations, unlike the Jerusalem Bible, place the phrase "put on the armour of light" in the centre of the passage and "put on the Lord Jesus Christ" at the end. This latter phrase suggests the white garment in which the newly baptised is robed.
