Australia Day!

Over the past 66 years (I came to Australia at the age of four) my understanding of Australia Day has changed. I started out thinking of Australia Day only as a lovely extra day off to be able to relax and run around outside with my friends. Seriously! Even at the age of 25 it never entered my mind to think about what Australia Day means, why we celebrate it. Then I started noticing!


Because of a comment my mother made, we nearly didn't migrate to Australia at all because of how racist Australia was/is (we came in 1956 and this conversation would have happened in about 1975 I think). Mum was thinking of the White Australia Policy, the segregation and bad treatment of First Nations, the discrimination against migrants that was rife. But ... in the end we came – a decade after the rest of my father's family – because of the career opportunities that were available.

Now, almost fifty years later I see many perspectives to Australia Day:

- The ca. 80,000 year presence, spirituality, culture of our wonderful First Peoples?
- Remembering the ways our society has grown and flourished
- Celebrating the inventiveness of all our peoples
- Mourning the tragic harm done to our First Nations peoples by our ancestors, and the racism that still exists towards
- Looking forwards to the opportunities of the future offered by the possibilities of reconciliation, or treaty, of voice to parliament.
- Giving thanks for the great graces God has given us in resources of the earth and the creativity so abundant among us.
- Looking forwards to the Church in Australia becoming fully what Jesus Christ wants by accepting / welcoming the contribution of our First Nations peoples.
- Concern for the ways we will manage / adapt to the changes in climate that are affecting us more and more.

My celebration of Australia day contains great elements of sorrow mixed with joy, arrival and opportunity joined with invasion and destruction. It is complicated! But I love Australia: I know it as home. It is the place where I most readily find or see Jesus Christ bringing God's love into the world. God bless Australia.

Fitzroy Crossing Floods Appeal

Today's second collection will go towards the Fitzroy Crossing Floods Appeal, which bore the brunt of what has been described as the worst flood in the state's history. The flood has created an inland sea spanning 50 kilometres, forcing hundreds of residents to flee, leaving roads impassable and isolating remote Aboriginal communities. With parts of Fitzroy Crossing completely inundated with water, authorities estimate as many as 100 homes have been damaged and more than 280 people across the Kimberley region have been relocated or evacuated.

Sister Nathalie Becquart XMCJ is a French nun of the Congregation of Xavières. In May 2019 she was appointed by Pope Francis as Consultor to the Synod of Bishops and in 2021 she was appointed by Pope Francis as Undersecretary of the Synod of Bishops. She is the first woman to ever hold this position in the Vatican and the first woman to have voting rights in the Synod of Bishops.

Sr Nathalie has played a significant role in both the Synod on Young People in 2018 and the Synod on the Pan-Amazon Region in 2019.

REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Second Reading

Isaiah 58: 7-10

Nothing much seems to be known about the prophet Zephaniah himself.

It's generally agreed that his work as a prophet took place sometime after Josiah became king of Judah at the age of eight around the year 640 BC.

In his adult years Josiah undertook major reforms, so it's likely that Zephaniah's condemnations of corruption preceded them.

Despite the work of both prophet and king, the disaster of the exile occurred in 587.

As well as his fearsome pronouncements about the "Day of the Lord" (giving rise to the medieval hymn, the *Dies irae*), Zephaniah is renowned for his focus on "the humble of the earth".

These were the poor who put their trust in God's saving power, not in earthly wealth or might. As humble people of integrity, trust and truthfulness, these "anawim" (the Hebrew word) will survive while the rest are swept away.

The reading joins a verse from chapter two, spoken by the prophet, to a passage from chapter three, spoken by the Lord.

1 Corinthians 2: 1-5

Not satisfied with scolding the Corinthians for their rival factions, Paul proceeds to puncture their sense of importance. Did they pride themselves on the superiority of their wisdom, influence and status? How wrong they were! What they thought or made of themselves was of no account, it's God's work that mattered. And God chose the foolish, the weak and the common, precisely to reduce would-be "somebodies" like the Corinthians to "nobodies".

All this is exemplified by no-one less than the crucified Christ. In the preceding verses (sadly, never heard on a Sunday), Paul has testified that he preaches "a crucified Christ, to the Jews an obstacle ... to the pagans madness, but to those who have been called ... the power and wisdom of God". This is the lesson Paul learned for himself, as stated in the letter to the Philippians: "I count everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ".

In brief, the Corinthians can claim no wisdom, virtue, holiness or freedom as their own. Instead, they have the wisdom, virtue, holiness and freedom that is Christ, and that is something to boast about. The first two-thirds of the reading is laced with sarcasm, but the last third is a powerful affirmation of the treasure they have gained in Christ.
