From the Desk of Fr Charles...

Holy Week! It starts in a week with Palm Sunday. Then, the Three Days (Triduum) in which we relive the Passion, Death and Resurrection. Christmas tells us God comes close, comes among us as one of us. Easter tells us God has given us new life and has healed our collective sin so it is natural for us to join him in his glory. Please, keep focussed on the growth in love of Christ you desired through your prayer, fasting and alms giving.

Gathering of Priests and Deacons of Melbourne: Last Thursday I joined 150 priests and deacons for a day at The Manningham. We talked about World Youth Day with about 585 young people going from Melbourne and about the Clergy Conference in June which will focus on Liturgy and how we can bring even more life to our celebration of Mass.

The Vocations Office has new leaders and is looking to help us find ways to encourage an understanding of vocation, with a focus of course on fostering priestly vocations.

Youth and Young People: Emma and Sylvana have begun working in the Archdiocese Proclaim Office to provide some new approaches to helping young people, individually and collectively, grow in capacity to discern the calls that God makes in their lives.

I was encouraged that there are new efforts happening at a diocese wide level that can support us as we seek to grow share our love of Christ.

Thu lost his leg after stepping on a land mine in Vietnam. He was just 12 years old. "War is most terrible with great loss. After the war, there are still consequences such as unexploded bombs, causing many losses, casualties and death." His province was one of the most heavily bombed areas during the Vietnam War and most polluted with unexploded bombs. Years later and in addition to being family breadwinner Thu has to care for his wife, Linh, after she suffered a stroke... 


Chrism Mass 2023

REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Ezekiel 37: 12-14 It's widely understood these days that the Paschal Vigil Though this passage from Romans

lies at the heart of the liturgical year, but its counterpart – the Vigil of Pentecost – is more like a best-kept secret. The lectionary offers a number of readings that can be used for an extended liturgy of the word on the eve of Pentecost. One of those readings is the full account of Ezekiel's vision that we only hear the conclusion of today.

Readers who check out the story in full will be rewarded. In his vision Ezekiel sees a valley full of dead bones. Gradually, step by step, the bones are covered with sinew, flesh and skin and then brought to life by the breath of God. It's a powerful oracle of encouragement for the demoralised exiles of Israel who feel they are as good as dead. It promises them new life, return to their homeland, and fresh adoption as God's people.

Today's reading comprises the final three verses of the vision. Without the dramatic build-up, their impact is diminished but they still convey a strong message of hope. Even in this short text there is a degree of repetition.

Though this passage from Romans begins on a negative note (the unspiritual can "never be pleasing to God"), the message overall is decidedly positive. The Spirit of God, Paul writes, has "made his home in you".

Through the Spirit believers are justified and belong to Christ.

In the final days, the Spirit living in them will give life to their "mortal bodies".


This affirmative view of Spirit and life is set against the "unspiritual" which means sin and death.

Paul is not setting up a dichotomy between flesh and spirit, as if bodily life itself was an evil.

He's contrasting life under the sway of sin with life governed by the Spirit.


As is so often the case, Paul's thought doesn't run in a simple linear direction.

It heads off on detours and sometimes reverses direction.
