A Word From our Lay Ecclesial Leader...

On Wednesdays, I teach in the city. As I walk along Swanston Street, early in the morning, I never fail to notice the bodies of the homeless asleep on the pavement, wrapped in their sleeping bags. A few meagre possessions scattered around them.

I am always moved by the sight. Homelessness is one of the greatest challenges people ever face. It is a reminder to me that I have been fortunate in my life to have always had a roof over my head. But a home is much more than that. A good home is a place where not just your physical, but your emotional and spiritual needs are met: a place where you feel safe, and loved for who you are.

This weekend, it is comforting to hear Jesus' message in the Gospel not to let our hearts be troubled. We are told he is the Way, the Truth and the Life, and he is preparing a home for us. A home of faith where we learn the Way (of fighting for peace and justice for everyone), the Truth (of speaking up against injustice) and the Life (valuing the dignity of every person).

The home of faith that Jesus makes for us is the springboard from which we go out to the world to share the Way, the Truth and the Life with a world that is often selfish and greedy. This, then, is the best kind of home.

The volunteer will no longer process the Lectionary or the book of Gospels at any time throughout the Mass. NEW PUBLIC LECTURE
