Winter Appeal Ends as we now Move Into National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (NATSI) Sunday

For this cold time of year a recent Parish Second Collection campaign helpfully raised \$2,106.75 for the St Vincent de Paul Winter Appeal. Moving forward, this weekend is the annual National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday where we focus our liturgy and thoughts on Indigenous peoples and spirituality, including First Nations Catholics who are the youngest and fastest growing demographic in the Australian Catholic Church, at this stage numbering 135,682. It's also a timely opportunity to consider the forthcoming Indigenous Voice Referendum where we will be invited to cast a vote. As part of NATSIC Sunday, the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Commission has produced a Parish NATSIC Sunday resource book which on pages 20-21 also includes a helpful section "Catholic Social Teaching and the Referendum". This is available for download from the parish Website Social Justice page. Our revived Parish Social Justice group has been in operation for almost a year now and will shortly Review the group by requesting your feedback!

Support Group: I put out a report before I went on holidays. That was two and a half months ago. We have not been sitting idle in the intervening weeks. We have been discussing how we might seek to better organise the work of the parish to enable me to focus my time more effectively for you and for the future. We have had one consultation session and we will have a joint Parish and Finance council gathering on 25th July to discuss our ideas. Then we'll be having broader discussions—with you. Two parishes: more effectively operating—more focussed on being disciples of Jesus Christ. *Fr Charles*

 woman of Shunem has clearly been chosen in view of Jesus' words in the gospel. He promises those who welcome a prophet or a holy one a commensurate reward. The unnamed woman's hospitality to Elisha begins with a single meal. It soon becomes a standard event whenever he passes by. 	In John the Baptist's witness to Jesus, in the gospel and letters of John, and in the Acts of the Apostles, baptism is associated with the gift of God's Spirit. The primary connotation of these references is new birth. In his letter to the Romans, Paul offers a different perspective on baptism. It's primarily Christocentric. To be baptised is to die and be buried with Christ and be raised to new life in him. This viewpoint is in harmony with Paul's			
The woman's husband takes the welcome much further by agreeing to build an upper room in the house for Elisha to stay.	intense focus on the mystery of Jesus' cross and resurrection. He will have more to say on life in the Spirit later in the letter.			
In response Elisha promises the woman perhaps the only thing she lacked – a son. We are not told whether she had any daughters; in he time and place what mattered was a son. If she was sonless and her ageing husband died, she would be left to fend for herself. There's much more to the story than this.	 There's a "now and not yet" thread through this reading. While Christians are baptised into Jesus' death and resurrection, they are still on the way. There's a provisional tone to what Paul writes. Christians are baptised so they "might live a new life". They are to "consider themselves to be dead to sin but alive in Christ Jesus". Christ's victory, by contrast, is definitive. He "will never die again his life now is life with God". While almost all the sentences in the reading are long and elaborate, they are made up of relatively short
