# From the Desk of Fr Charles...

Frist, a comment/thought:

Behaviours: where has common courtesy gone? Where has respect gone? Where has a loving attitude gone? People revving their V8's in a school carpark after a funeral - and it was a school day! A man urinating in public on our premises.

Confidentiality: stories getting back via gossip to people about meetings, pastoral conversations, events, where they thought the discussion was to be held close.

These are not earth-shattering matters, but they are important to note.

It wasn't you, I am sure, doing these things. Nothing major arose from these events, I could just ignore them. But! To allow them to pass uncommented goes counter to the truth that we are each created in the image of God and so deserve respect, dignity, thoughtfulness.

Please, call people out on their misbehaviours. Don't listen to gossip, and perhaps tell others to stop and to keep confidences ... confidential.

And now to something else:

On Wednesday just past, I attended the second half (I was busy with a funeral) of a gathering of priests ordained less than 10 years (yes, I still number in that group, my priestly ordination was in 2015 so still two years of gatherings to go). It is interesting for me to go to these sessions as I am 40 years, a wife, two sons, a grand-daughter, and a business career different from everyone else. It is interesting because without conscious thought I see the world differently. I see the need for nurture and encouragement. I see the need for creating opportunities for growth. I see the need for co-responsibility and encouraging new ideas. I see the need for building family, community, relationships among you, among us.

What I hear in the enthusiasm of some of the other young priests seems to start in having ideas to get the people to do what they want/desire and within that realising the community I think about.

For better or worse: YOU are first in my mind. My leadership arises from wanting YOU to grow and flourish in faith and bring your talents to bear so you can open your hearts even further to the Holy Spirit and help others to hear the call to come to know Jesus Christ.



I am in love with Jesus Christ, I want you to love him even more than I do (quite possibly you already do so), and to share that love with others generously, and invite others to come and learn more about his gentleness, compassion, forgiveness, and mercy. I can only do that through my experience of life. I pray that my approach can lead you to deeper faith.

Many people are challenged by rising costs and uncertain futures, yet the people of St Kevin's Parish continue to support those facing greater challenges. On Good Friday our Parish collected for the Annual Holy Places appeal for Christian people living difficult lives in Israel, Palestine, Egypt, Syria, Jordan. Lebanon, Rhodes and Cyprus, and for Holy Places there. We raised \$1,777.50 which, added to collections from other Parishes, really helps. Following that our Parish contribution to Project compassion this year came to \$4,459.75 (including a \$302.50 donation from St Kevin's school). When we recall the short weekly videos shown at Mass during Project Compassion we gain a fuller sense of the lives of people this donation has positively helped improve. Easter is over and we now return to Ordinary Time. We are all *called to Mission*, and now is a good time. 


# 50 years of Family Groups in Australia!




ST KEVIN'S PARISH, TEMPLESTOWE

# REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF TRINITY SUNDAY

# Ex 34: 4-6. 8-9

A reading from the book of Exodus

# The Lord God, ruler of all, merciful and loving.

Today's reading from Exodus is illuminated by two prior episodes in the book. The first occurred before the exodus event. Moses had fled Egypt after being seen to murder an Egyptian. It was while he was minding his father-in-law's sheep at Mt Horeb that he saw the burning bush and encountered God. God was revealed to him as "I am who I am" and as the "God of your fathers". These names for God are now expanded on. Israel's God is "a God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness". This divine self-description became an article of faith for Israel, repeated elsewhere in the Pentateuch and in the psalms and prophets. The verse that follows, pledging punishment for transgressions, has been omitted from the lectionary text.

The omission has a certain logic to it because what preceded Moses' ascent of Mt Sinai was Israel's lapse into idolatry with the golden calf.

In response Moses had destroyed the original two tablets of the Law.

He now takes two new ones with him up the mountain.

There God reveals more of the divine name, hears Moses' plea for forgiveness and, in the passage that follows today's, establishes a new covenant with the Israelites instead of punishing them for their apostasy. This is a text of high importance.

# 2 Cor 13: 11-13

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Paul's second letter to the Christian community in Corinth has so many disconcerting changes of mood that a number of scholars think it was compiled from a number of different letters. Whatever the case, there's no trace of the strong emotions expressed earlier in the letter to be found in the conclusion that we read today. These final three verses are calm, plainly expressed and affectionate. There is none of Paul's characteristic rhetoric or complex theological argumentation, only sound advice. He offers them a simple set of encouraging directives for living the Christian way. It's the greeting with which he signs off that is most pertinent today. It should sound familiar because it's one of the regular greetings which the presider may offer the assembly at the beginning of the eucharistic celebration.

The trinitarian formula Paul employs is not the product of abstract theological speculation. It long predates the subtle and complex arguments about the Trinity that followed in later centuries. Paul's greeting is firmly grounded in his religious experience. His Jewish heritage – profound faith in the one true God – has been enriched by his life-changing discovery of Christ and the power of the Spirit. With this greeting Paul is inviting the Corinthians, and succeeding generations, to make his personal experience their own.
