A word from the Lay Ecclesial Leader...

I read a very interesting homily of this weekend's Gospel by Richard Leonard SJ. In the gospel, Matthew describes the transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor. The text also mentions Moses. He also went up a mountain (Sinai) and had an experience of God. According to Fr Leonard, however, the similarity ends there.

Firstly, Moses goes up the mountain alone, Jesus takes his disciples who witness the transfiguration. God is hidden from Moses, whereas Jesus is given to us as the face of God in the world. On Sinai, Moses receives the law, and he must ensure that people obey it. On Tabor, Jesus receives a proclamation of God's love, and we are told to listen to him. While Moses' face shines, Jesus' whole body is transfigured with light.

The following words of Fr Leonard's have struck a chord with me:

'The God of Mount Tabor is not interested in us feeling isolated as we fulfill the law to the letter. He wants us to have hearts that listen to the Gospel of love so that we can gain the power to transform the world through the sacrifices of our daily lives.'

I am humbled by our parishioners who take up the challenge of the Gospel of love to transform the world by giving of themselves. We have a range of ministries through which this love is given to others. Jesus calls us to do more than follow the rules of our faith but also to give of ourselves for the sake of others.

I am delighted that this month marks the one-year anniversary of our Men's Social Group. There is a committed and regular group of men who, once a month, meet, share a meal, chat and have developed a sincere fellowship.

REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

First Reading

Second Reading

Daniel 7: 9-10. 13-14

A reading from the book of Daniel

His raiment was as white as snow.

The book of Daniel is placed in the Bible with the writings of the prophets, but is distinguished by its late composition and the nature of its contents. Although it presents Daniel as an exile in Babylon, the work was compiled centuries later, when the Jewish people were being persecuted by the Syrian king Antiochus Epiphanes. This threat to their survival was countered by apocalyptic literature –writing characterised by cosmic visions and revelations promising ultimate victory over the powers of evil.

Today's reading comes from a section in the book where Daniel has a dream in which a succession of kingdoms appear.

The first four are represented by earthly monsters, but the fifth, as we hear, features a figure that is both human and heavenly.

Drawing on imagery from the psalms and especially the prophet Ezekiel, "one like a son of man" appears before the heavenly court and is granted eternal dominion over the entire world.

Just as various sources have contributed to this depiction, so in turn Daniel's vision is cited several times in the New Testament apocalypse, the book of Revelation.

It also contributes directly to the story of Jesus' transfiguration.

2 Peter 1: 16-19

A reading from the second letter of St Peter We heard this voice from out of heaven.

The jury is out as to whether 2 Peter was the last work of the New Testament to be composed, but there's no doubt that it was the last to be included in the list or canon of inspired Christian writings. Contrary to contemporary concerns about authenticity and plagiarism, it was customary in the ancient world for works to be attributed to a revered figure of the past. In this case, 2 Peter purports to be the last testament of the apostle Peter, though it must have been written some decades after his death and in a polished style unlikely to be that of a Galilean fisherman.

To bolster his authority, the author claims to have been a witness to the transfiguration of Jesus. The brief description of the event is in accord with the gospel accounts of this unique event. More particularly, the author invokes this experience to rebut claims that his teaching about the final coming of Christ is just a "cleverly invented myth". He also wants to attest to the reliability of prophecy "as a lamp for lighting a way through the dark ... until the morning star rises in your minds".

As it stands, this reading is an unqualified affirmation of Jesus as God's Beloved Son and an endorsement of the prophetic word of God. Proclaimed with clarity and conviction, it readies the worshipping community for the gospel account of the transfiguration.
