





Yesterday's News Neither Complete Nor Forgotten

Following relentless reporting of bad News it's natural at times and healthy to briefly seek only good news and forget what's uncomfortable. Mid week at least after the horror of Gaza/Israel and while anticipating even more horror to come the brief shadow of media distraction with happier news briefly provides some therapeutic respite, for those not still suffering. It's a brief opportunity to rebalance, and contemplate the future. Following the failed Referendum those who voted YES have taken time to mourn, reflect and consider the future. NO voters also contemplate the renewed uncertainty left by the Referendum failure. Some narrow media reports described the Referendum outcome as 'resounding' rejection, however 5,392,661 YES votes is far from resounding and tells another story, a story yet to be resolved. Interestingly the Reading from Exodus this weekend provides a reminder of God's special love for the poor and the week, and his righteous anger when the disenfranchised are treated badly. That's a reminder to each and every one of us to actively do whatever we can to break down divisions and overcome injustice. In a small way at least this weekend's World Mission Sunday, deferred from last Sunday to accommodate the Caritas Gaza emergency Appeal, provides us with such an opportunity. - John Costa, SJA

Come together for a peaceful prayer time with faith leaders and representatives.




The public is welcome to attend this peaceful prayer time.

REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading

Exodus 22: 20-26

A reading from the book of Exodus

If you are harsh with the widow or the orphan, my anger will rage against you.

As the book of Exodus has come down to us, the story of Moses receiving the Decalogue (Ten Words rather than Ten Commandments) is followed by what is called the Book of the Covenant (Ex 20:22-23:33). This is a collection of laws and regulations governing the life of the community. It spells out the people's obligations towards their neighbours rather than towards God. The code is similar to that contained in other legal documents of the time but is grounded in the living memory of Israel's exodus experience. Representing all those who are to be treated with kindness and protected are the stranger, the widow and the orphan. These three categories of people continue to be emblematic of the most vulnerable in society who deserve special care. Compassion and kindness towards such needy ones are complemented by fair dealing with people who are in financial straits. They are not to be taken advantage of.

The basis for these ethical imperatives is God's passionate concern for the poor and the weak. This is the fundamental premise on which all neighbourly love is based. It is also the rationale for God's righteous anger when the defenceless are treated badly. Apart from the disturbing reference to God's anger, this is an appealing text for reader and assembly alike.

1 Thessalonians 1: 5-10

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians

You turned away from idols to serve God and await his Son.

Today's reading from 1 Thessalonians follows immediately on from last week's, with the result that we hear the whole first chapter of the letter. We learn that the Thessalonians have faced "great opposition" ("persecution," NRSV). The joy with which they have embraced the gospel means that they have become model believers for others, not only in Macedonia and the neighbouring province of Achaia, but "everywhere". This is the multiplier effect of Paul's original presentation of himself as a model for the Thessalonians to imitate.

His reference to them having broken "with idolatry" to become "servants of the real, living God" strongly implies that the Thessalonians had come from a pagan rather than a Jewish background. The passage concludes with a brief credal statement. God raised his Son, Jesus, from the dead, and Jesus will return to bring the world to final judgement. This mention of Jesus' return foreshadows Paul's treatment of the community's problematic expectations later in the letter.

If this is indeed Paul's first letter, his characteristic fertility of thought is on display at the outset of his writing career. One thought leads to another, and so the phrases, clauses and sentences pile up. All in all, this is an encouraging and affirmative text.
