Alpha

<u>What is Alpha?</u> **Alpha** is an opportunity for people to share a meal, ask questions about important matters of life, faith and meaning and, in the search for the answer, come to know Jesus and grow closer to God.

We completed the May-August Alpha round early in August and received very positive feedback. The participants enjoyed the experience. It is rewarding to hear they felt they have grown in their relationship with God as a result of Alpha. Some participants have signed up to help us run the next round.

Preparations are underway for a final round of Alpha for 2024 – it will run for 9 weeks from October 9 to December 4, with a day away retreat on 16 November.

Running an Alpha program takes time and effort. We are building slowly the teams of helpers/leaders that are needed for the program to run sustainably over time. At this stage, we have a relatively small number of volunteers to run Alpha, as a result I am heavily involved in the planning and running of the program.

2. Envelope Distribution

Action: David will ensure 100 pledge cards (Catch-All cards) from Archdiocese plus

Census Card 2024 are available for those without envelopes.

Action: David will coordinate with Fr. Charles and Tiziana to inform the

parishioners about our current ministries and upcoming projects for the

Parish.

Action: Frances will create a pie chart that details the expenses and revenues for

transparency.

Action: David/Tiziana will roster volunteer(s) to assist parishioners in finding their

envelopes after Mass.

Action: Tiziana will be creating a poster and slices to promote our Thanksgiving

Campaign. The theme is "What does St Kevin's Parish mean to you?"

b. Weekend 1 (Saturday 5th October/Sunday 6th October):

Action: Fr. Charles will celebrate the 530 PM Mass on Saturday, 5th October,

and the 830 AM and 10 AM Masses on Sunday, 6th October, to brief

parishioners about the Thanksgiving Campaign and the parish's financial reliance on donations.

The campaign is an opportunity for ongoing givers/donors to renew or review their donations, not to add to their existing pledges. To include a thank you note in the envelopes for our ongoing givers and donors, expressing our gratitude for their generous support of the Parish.

The parish depends entirely on **donations and investment incomes**; it does not receive financial support from the **Archdiocese or Vatican City or the government**.

Funds raised will cover the levy to the Archdiocese and daily church operating expenses and **the cost of running each ministry.**

Weekend 2 (Saturday 12th October/Sunday 13th October):

Action: Fr. Gerry will celebrate the 530 PM Mass on Saturday, 12th October and

830 AM and 10 AM Masses on Sunday, 13th October, to brief parishioners about the Thanksgiving Campaign, the parish's financial reliance on donations and deliver a friendly reminder to the parishioners to pick up

his/her envelopes.

d. Weekend 3 (Saturday 19th October/Sunday 20th October):

and the 830 AM and 10 AM Masses on Sunday, 20th October, to inform parishioners about the Thanksgiving Campaign and deliver a friendly

reminder to the parishioners to return the completed envelopes.

Action: Nadia will input data into Pacem.

Action: David has confirmed with Daniel Wise, the Fundraising Officer from the

St Kevin's Parish Social Justice Action 5 Sept. 2024 Report to PPC Meeting

1. St Kevin's Parish Second Collections.

Amongst all else this will have been a year heavily focused on fundraising Campaigns, the recent Archbishops Campaign, the forthcoming Parish Thanksgiving Campaign, and the scheduled Parish 2nd

Collections. Following this PPC Meeting today the SJA group will review the Parish 2nd Collection campaign and current & future associated planning and handling arrangements.

2. Engagement with special needs

- i). Updating the situation of an elderly former (and very active) Parishioner desperately seeking accommodation in the (preferably) Croydon area having been given notice to leave her rented accommodation, parishioners (including some from St Greg's) have been forthcoming and very helpful with offers of temporary accommodation, offers of some financial support, helpful suggestions, and very much goodwill and moral support. Along the way we have also laboriously engaged with numerous agencies specialising is such needs. Despite all that extensive effort, the actual shortage of suitable housing has so far not resulted in suitable accommodation. This highlights the already well known dire position for those seeking reasonably accessible accommodation. Luckily for her, delays in the sale process to date have allowed her to temporarily remain in her rented unit. This need is continuing, however the lady concerned has been deeply moved and encouraged by all the support she has nevertheless received from our Parishes.
- ii). The migrant family recently seeking a no longer needed sewing machine to make family clothes they can't otherwise afford to purchase were delighted and very thankful for the machine that was kindly offered by a parishioner after last weekend's Parish Newsletter.

3. Future SJA events and ongoing 'communication' arrangements

4. Catholic Bishops' Social Justice Statement

We will continue to focus on and support this significant document in the Parish over the period ahead, while also recognising an unfortunate omission in this document.

The Statement's First Paragraph quotes Pope John XXIII's Encyclical Pacem in Terris making "an impassioned plea not only to the Church but to all people of goodwill for an end to war and the banning of nuclear weapons". However it makes no mention of the UN Treaty on the Prohibition on Nuclear Weapons (TPNW) which Pope Francis has given so much support: The "courageous vision" of the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons "appears ever more timely," Pope Francis says in a Message for the First Meeting of States Parties to the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW).

He said further that "A world free of nuclear weapons is necessary and possible" (Vatican News). During his visit to the UN in New York Pope Francis also spoke powerfully on this significant Treaty. The Australian Government is one of just a few major economies (also including the United States) that so far haven't endorsed the Treaty.
