## FIRST SUNDAY OF Adven

The beginning! We start a year with the Gospel of Luke as the primary focus in our Sunday readings. Luke's Gospel was written to people like us – 'Gentiles' – unfamiliar with the intricacy and intimate detail of Jewish life and faith, but deeply vested in loving Jesus Christ and wanting to know his story. If you choose to read the Gospel through, please don't stop with the Gospel, read Acts as well – what we include as two books are two parts of one composition – reaching from Christ's birth well into the early life of the church after Pentecost and the Ascension.

There are numerous ways to approach Luke's works: as prophetic works (or works showing the fulfilment of prophecy); as an illumination of the Hospitality of God; as an exposition of who Jesus is so as to bring us to a deeper knowledge of him as THE Christ and the Son of God who brings us God's Holy Spirit.

I look forward to journeying with you and encourage you to read more broadly than just the weekly readings.

As we start our journey you will find some different things happening – to jolt you out of the routine: The Advent Wreath and Candles which are lit progressively; New Banners pointing us to themes we might pray on and read on; The Christmas tree – opening us to continual growth (it is an evergreen, growing even in the coldest of times); At St Greg's we are going to have a brief reflection from some of our Young Adults at the start of each Mass; At St Kevin's we are going to make use of the Aboriginal Symbol of the Coolamon giving a different perspective on how to wait for Jesus.

It is exciting. As I type this, I am excited. In preparing for putting up my Christmas Trees in my home, I discovered some wonderful ornaments that Tanya purchased long ago that have been waiting to be discovered and put out to welcome our Lord and Saviour.

#### Fr Charles' Prayer Intentions:

Some time ago I started asking for prayers for specific intentions, generally to do with the needs of our parish. I started this in a small way, including the intention in our newsletter each week (have a look for it) and asking two people to include the intention at the adoration and rosary times that they help lead.

My thought was to begin a practice of intentionally seeking through prayer the help of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit as we seek to grow into the future.

There will be some work to do to grow this effort.to be parish wide but it seems to be working in this small way.

If you have a group you pray with, or a bible study group, or a Diving Mercy group or a coffee after Mass group, any other group that gathers in some way related to our faith: please let me know so I can send my prayer intention to you each week.

Advent season has begun. Let's journey together as we prepare for the coming of the Messiah.


Come along to our parish Advent Group Reflection.

### Pope names Melbourne's Bishop Mykola Bychok as one of 21 new cardinals

In a historic announcement, Pope Francis has nominated Melbourne's Bishop Mykola Bychok, Head of the Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Sts Peter and Paul, as one of 21 new cardinals to be created at a consistory in Rome on 8 December 2024. Bishop Bychok's elevation to the College of Cardinals is not only a moment of great joy for Ukrainian Catholics in Australia and Oceania, but also marks an important milestone for the broader Australian Church. Warmly congratulating Bishop Bychok—who at 44 is the youngest of the new cardinals-delegate—Archbishop Peter A Comensoli noted how closely he 'lives after the heart of the Good Shepherd, working tirelessly among the lives of the faithful entrusted to his care'. #### Suffering & Hope?

How can we reconcile the strong hope that Advent calls us to embrace, and the worldly and at times local horrors that so often otherwise surround us. TV Screens and audiences seem sometimes to delight in the extremes of warfare, bombings, destruction, hatred, and human misery. Yet sustaining such awareness hopefully eventually prompts outrage, with instinctive and faith-based responses. As election time approaches there is further hope for meaningful conversation on a wide range of important issues, although clearly that doesn't happen at all elections. Perhaps Advent might allow time to reflect further on the Beatitudes? It would be good to think that our forthcoming elections might provide opportunity for identifying and resolving important issues, but clearly that's not always the case, as for 'debate' on 'The Voice". The Brigidine Asylum Seeker Project (BASP) exemplifies an opportunity by currently provide factual and faith-related information on the consequences of proposed new immigration laws. But as was seen with The Voice, and recent overseas elections , facts don't always drive serious debates, or good outcomes. Over time, Synodality provides further opportunity for bringing hope and Mission to many issues - *John Costa SJA*
