
Come along to our parish Advent Group Reflection.

#### Pope calls 21 new cardinals, including Melbourne's Cardinal Mykola Bychok, to build church unity



Becoming a cardinal is an insistent call to put Jesus at the centre of one's life, to love the poor as he did and to strengthen the bonds of unity within the Catholic Church, Pope Francis said as he created 21 new cardinals from 17 nations. Among them was Cardinal Mykola Bychok of the Ukrainian Eparchy of Sts Peter and Paul in Melbourne, who at 44 becomes the youngest serving cardinal and Australia's highest ranking Catholic.

'To walk in the path of Jesus means, in the end, to be builders of communion and unity,' the Pope told the new cardinals during an afternoon consistory on 7 December in St Peter's Basilica.

The elevation of cardinals took place within a prayer service, attended by thousands of people, including current members of the College of Cardinals and Australian representatives Archbishop Peter A Comensoli of Melbourne and vice-president of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference (ACBC) Bishop Greg Bennet of Sale. ### Archbishop Comensoli: Advent, a time of preparation and expectation

As we enter into the season of Advent once again, embarking on a new Church year, Archbishop Peter A Comensoli reflects on Advent as a time of preparation and expectation.

Advent, he explains, is 'a time of preparation, of anticipation, of preparing ... towards the time of the incarnation, of the birth of our Saviour, Jesus Christ, when God became one of us, became human.'

Archbishop Comensoli encourages us to view Advent not so much as a penitential season but as a time of joyful expectation. 'In expectation, we prepare, and in preparing, we look forward,' he says. This season invites us to be attentive and awake, both to the commemoration of Christ's birth and to the eternal gift of life that his incarnation has brought us.

**Catholic organisations reject changes to Migration Bills** 

(Extract from CathNews 6 Dec. 2024). Catholic Social Services Victoria, the Catholic Alliance for People Seeking Asylum and the Refugee Council, have expressed deep concerns about the implications of the Migration Amendment Bills passed last week by the Senate. These include St Vincent dePaul; Sydney Archdiocese Office of Justice & Peace; Jesuit Refugee Service Australia; Edmund Rice Centre; Brigidine Asylum Seeker Project; and Jesuit Social Services. Amongst other measures, the Bill includes Authority for the Government to: Remove a refugee's protection finding to remove them from Australia; Deny people in immigration detention centres mobile phone connections (so important to relationships and services); Pay undisclosed third countries to warehouse non-citizens; Imprison people who will not return to countries where they fear for their lives; Create travel bans for citizens of certain countries; Permanently and forceably separate more families. Next Year SJA plans to facilitate an information session and discussion on these issues.- John Costa SJA
