## St Kevin's Parish Council Meeting

5<sup>th</sup> June 2025

**Minutes** 

The meeting opened at 2.30 pm.

Present: Fr Charles, Fr Anton, John Costa, Adrian Teo, Carmel Shiel, Gabee Leone,

David Hii, Ana Saro, Pauline Erickson.

Opening Prayer. Carmel read a prayer of thanksgiving.

Discussion arising from previous minutes.

Role of LEL. More thought and development of ideas is required for the role of a new LEL. Input and discussion from Parish Council members is encouraged. Finding a person to take on the changing role is challenging.

Some discussion on change of Mass times, further explored in report from Ana Saro. Current reports,

- Fr Charles. A successful overseas trip for Fr Charles. He has come home with the heightened conscious thought of helping people to become aware of the presence of Jesus and love of God in each of our lives.
  - Fr Charles to have a meeting with MACS to discuss the future possibilities of the site of St Charles School.
  - St Kevin's Mass count shows that numbers are stable in comparison to 2024.
- 2) School Principal Gabee Leone. Successful St Vinnies day, emphasising Hope Grows Here! St Kevin's feast day, cross country, working bee, all successful events in the school calendar. Twenty enrolments for 2026 with more school tours required and planned.
- 3) Social Justice John Costa. John reported on the Arch Bishop's campaign, recent contact with Catholic Social Services Victoria, invitation to address St Kevin's Confirmation candidates re SJA and the ongoing work in other related social justice areas. John will present an action plan later in the year addressing areas in which St Kevin's may help refugees. He has requested that the SJA be made aware of any new ideas within the Parish that may affect the social justice group and their ongoing work.
- 4) Pastoral Worker Ana Saro. Ana continues with the Sacramental programme, Safeguarding, Outreach and nursing home visits, playgroup and youth group. Looking for people to join St Vinnie's group,
  - Combination of 8.30am and 10am Masses. After some discussion on format, Ana to prepare a survey to be distributed at all Masses over the weekends of

14/15th June and 21/22nd June and also by email in order to gauge parishioner's preferences for this suggested change.

5) Business Manager – David Hii. Columbarium and modifications to the Sanctuary plans progressing. Further discussion re information for interested parishioners will be provided after the next PPC meeting.

General Business.

Carmel Shiel is providing Anne's wheelchair on loan for the use of parishioners from car to inside the church.

#### Sacramental Program.

Confirmation classes x 4 completed. There are 16 children enrolled between school and Parish. Bishop Thinh organised to come and visit children and have lunch with Fr Charles at the Reflection day next Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> June.

## Safeguarding.

WWCC and COC updated on PACEM. We have 80 volunteers. 61 have completed the training. There are approx 12 that we are chasing for WWCC & COC.

Safeguarding meetings continue monthly.

### **Outreach and Nursing Home Visits.**

St Kevin's Parish continues to support 13 nursing homes in the surrounding area. The plan is to increase the number of homes the priest visits for weekly masses- at the moment Anton visits 12 nursing homes across the month. We hope to extend that to Silverwood and Charlesbrook. We have also organised for Templestowe Views to join us every 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of the month for 0915 mass and morning tea. Templestowe Manor continue to attend for 0915 mass and morning tea every 4rth Thursday of the month.

Templestowe Grove is also attending the first Tuesday of the month and attending the knitting group- I am providing the afternoon tea. The first visit was this week and there was 22 people in attendance. A huge thank you to Adrian for his amazing help:

Bookish Morning tea continues and is growing. We now average 6-8 people each time. Lots of fun!!

#### Youth Group.

Each meeting remains very energetic. The next meeting is on Saturday 21st June. The theme is 'Olympics'.

#### Playgroup.

Advertized in Manningham News and in Maternal health centres—good response- we now have 6 regular families.

#### St Vincent De Paul

We have a dedicated team of only Adrian and myself. We are advertising in the church bulletin - looking for people to join us.

## Baptism.

There is one family booked for July so far. Another family that had booked in and attended the preparation class has postponed.

## Report to Parish Pastoral Council Meeting, 5 June 2025

## 1. 'Archbishop's Campaign' - resolving where to disburse 'Chaplaincy' 2<sup>nd</sup> Collections (etc)

The 'Archbishop's Campaign' (AC) launched last year altered arrangements for particular causes and where to send their associated 2<sup>nd</sup> Collection donations, specifically including 'Chaplaincy' (e.g. for Prisons, Hospitals, Schools, Universities, and the General Community). This was initially handled by Catholic Care, but that arrangement ended with the AC launch. Seeking advice on this from the CAM Philanthropy & Development Director David Powick resulted in the original arrangement for 'Chaplaincy' donation disbursement being reinstated (for now at least). In a mutually productive discussion with David on 'promoting' particular charities he was impressed with our successful SJA 2<sup>nd</sup> Collection promotion process, and in future as part of a revamped Archbishop's Campaign will incorporate specific promotions for each element of the AC 's previously more *collective* Archbishop's Campaign.

## 2. Follow-up Discussion with Executive Director, Catholic Social Services Victoria (CSSV)

In previously agreeing to our invitation, Catholic social service Victoria Executive Director Joshua Lourenz indicated preference for a live rather than our initially suggested Zoom event. While confident of a *large Zoom* audience as we have previously achieved (e.g. with Sr Brigid Arthur of the Brigidine Aylum Seeker Network, (then) Sherry Balcome of the Aboriginal Catholic Ministry, and Opening The Doors Foundation, a multi-Parish attendance at Lawrence Cecconello's impressive Camino-walk presentation [after promotion to other Parishes] but fearful of a very *small live* Parish audience for CSSV I recently met with and discussed this (& more) with Joshua. He enthusiastically reaffirmed willingness to speak, as we re-consider viability of a live audience (perhaps this time, say, a 'Young Adults' group).

### 3. Invitation to speak to St Kevin's PS Confirmation candidates about Parish SJA

I have happily accepted an invitation to speak briefly about St Kevin's Parish SJA, and how Year 5 & 6 Confirmation candidates might possibly contribute to Social Justice (For several years our Schools and Parish have already jointly actively supported Loyo and more recently also Mantayupan Elementary Schools in the Philippines).

### 4. Winter coat blanket Drive

Prompted by beautifully hand-knitted blankets and beanies from the Parish Knitting Group, Carmel Purdey has again arranged this year's drive in conjunction with Catholic Care.

#### 5. Social Justice Action Online Promotion and Communication

As previously planned, an SJA sub-group comprising Tony Robinson, Carmel Purdey and Bernard Butler has developed a draft short resource on this for SJA finalisation.
