<u>Safeguarding:</u> The archdiocese of Melbourne will be audited for its compliance with the Eleven Safeguarding standards. This process will start in August and go through till November. 10 Diocesan bodies and 12 parishes will be audited in detail. Time will tell which parishes: it could be us! We are, we believe, well placed in having robust Safeguarding practices and procedures and that means "thank you" for your participation, and compliance and willingness to build a culture of safeguarding that is pro-active. If you are not up to date with Working with Children Check, Police Check, Code of Conduct or Safeguarding Essentials Training then please get your checks done and do the training asap and seek help from the parish office if you are struggling.

Mass Amalgamation: thank you for the 67 responses to the survey: it will close this weekend: Don't repeat your input, but 67 is only half the number of people coming to the 8:30 and 10 am Masses: if you haven't put in your thoughts, please do so **NOW**. There will be a discussion and, I would expect, a decision at the Parish Council meeting this coming week.



REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading Second Reading

Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23

A reading from the book of Ecclesiastes What do people gain by all their work?

This anonymous work by someone who calls himself Qoheleth is quite sceptical in tone. First, however, we need a definition of 'vanity' which occurs seven times in as many lines. Its usual meaning is an excessive self-esteem, a narcissistic overestimation of what people think of us. But that is not what it means here. 'Vanity' in Ecclesiastes refers to the transitory nature of the things of this world which makes all human endeavour futile and empty. This brief text sets up the listener for the message of the gospel, not in its pessimistic assessment of human achievement, but in circumscribing the value of material possessions and the things of this world.

Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Colossians Seek the things that are above where Christ is.

The second reading in Ordinary Time is independent of the other Scripture texts in the Liturgy of the Word. Today there is a felicitous link when the people of Colossus are urged to purge themselves of what belongs only to earthly life, notably greed. We belong to Christ and Christ 'is everything and is in everything'. Yes, by his incarnation, Christ shares our earthly existence, but risen to glory, he directs our attention to the things of heaven. We have transcended earthly life when we were brought back to new life with Christ.

It is precisely this life in Christ which leaves no room for distinctions between Greek and Jew, slave or free. In our baptism, we strip off the old and clothe ourselves in the new so that we become a new creation. Embracing Christ and the gospel reveals to us a new dimension to human existence, namely, the promise of glory.

The reading has a U-shaped format. It begins and ends with the heavenly Christ. In between, it descends to the depths of 'old-self' behaviour. The reading builds to a strong conclusion and a triumphant final sentence. *Taken from 'Break Open the Word'*

Ongoing War and Malnutrition - What do I think? You think? We think?

Before briefly reminding ourselves of distressing global news and photographs, here firstly is further good news from our Parish: At our recent special NATSIC weekend Masses the 2nd Collection raised \$858.85 to support the work of the National Aboriginal and Torres strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSIC). In deepening our understanding and appreciation of the diverse cultures and histories of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, the prayers, reflections, and hymns in our special weekend Mass Liturgy helped inspire us all to walk together in reconciliation, respect, and unity.......But need for such inspiration similarly relates, urgently and in different ways, to distressing Gaza reports (The Age, 29 July 2024, Cara Ana).......... "There is no policy of starvation in Gaza, and there is no starvation in Gaza. We enable humanitarian aid throughout the duration of the war to enter Gaza – otherwise, there would be no Gazans." - Benjamin Netanyahu......"The World Health Organisation said on Sunday there had been 63 malnutrition-related deaths in Gaza this month, including 24 children under the age of five – up from 11 deaths total the previous six months of the year"......"Gaza's Health Ministry puts the number even higher, reporting 82 deaths this month of malnutrition-related causes: 24 children and 58 adults." That's growing deaths from malnutrition, and continuing. But from the same news source even more distressing UNICEF figures for "Children diagnosed with malnutrition in Gaza" are: March 2025 (3,259); May 2025 (5,514), and June 2025 (5,870). So what do I, You and We think about that? More importantly what might we do? Keep aware! Discuss it among ourselves! Pray! Do anything? - Of course, though not much directly perhaps. What does Christ tell each of us we should do? Perhaps we could at least consider speaking out? e.g. individually or collectively writing letters of support for the government's critical statements on Gaza with others around the world? Perhaps our Parish Pastoral Council might consider whether we could/should collectively do more than remain silent? So, if anything, what do I, You and We think we should do, as Christ calls us? - John Costa SJA
