From the desk of the PP...

Archbishop's Campaign: this is the big weekend for this campaign. This weekend you are asked to make a commitment to regular donations or to make a single donation via electronic means, envelopes or cash.

This campaign helps you and I ensure that the Archdiocese can pursue diocese wide efforts to grow the faith, to spread the Good News. Please, be generous – as I know you always are.

<u>Clergy Conference</u>: I spent nearly four days at the 2025 Clergy conference. A good bit of relaxation. A good bit of conversation with fellow priests, and deacons, and even a couple of bishops. A large amount of challenging thinking about the Theological Virtue of Hope in today's world with Joel and Antonia, senior academics from the Australian Catholic University, leading us. The topic arises from the Jubilee Year: Pilgrims of Hope.

My take aways are: We must begin and live our days, always, with a humble recognition of our faith, an intention to ground all our actions in love: the Love Jesus brings us from God, a love that demands to be shared. And, alongside Faith and Love to recognise Hope.

Hope that is a gift from God. that is a gift that reveals our human hope as part of the truth that we are created in the image of God. Hope that expands our human hope to encompass the truth of Jesus Christ as our saviour and friend. Hope that calls us to action to seek to do our part to bring about the Reign of God in the world – right here and now, today, everyday.

It is Hope that enables us to imagine beyond our daily lives and to see things, small things, that can bring about a new world, a better world, a world that draws us into the Reign of God.

It was interesting to me to tease out that Hope is not optimism; Hope is not an empty platitude; Hope is not wishful thinking. Rather, Hope is an expectation of the Reign of God progressively coming to reality throughout time: an expectation grounded in the life, passion, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus.

Hope! The fullness of hope, is an active virtue; an active way of living; an essentially communal effort by each of us and all of us are moved to follow Christ through all the trials/suffering and into an ever more present Reign of God in our hearts and in our communities.



REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE TWENTY FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading

<u>Isaiah 66:18-21</u>

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

They will gather all of your people from all nations.

Jerusalem is a symbol of God's new kingdom. Here, at the end of his book, Isaiah sets out a vision of people from all over the known world streaming to Jerusalem where God's glory will be revealed. Some will be sent on mission by the Lord to proclaim God's glory and to gather everyone in.

It is a startling message for those who thought of themselves as specially chosen and favoured by God. Isaiah's vision is radically inclusive. Even the priesthood and the sacred mysteries of the Temple will be opened to some of those who come.

The variety of modes of transport makes a colourful list.

Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

The Lord disciplines those he loves.

This passage from Hebrews uses a challenging metaphor that many today would not accept - that of a father training and disciplining his son. The NRSV translation uses 'child' and 'parent' throughout, but there is a case for maintaining the masculine metaphor of father and son throughout. As a sign of his love, the father corrects and reprimands his son, he trains him with punishment. For the son, this experience is painful and unpleasant, but he takes it seriously and does not get discouraged. Ultimately the practice bears fruit in peace and goodness.

The question is whether people today accept the reality upon which the metaphor is based. This will make it difficult for them to receive the message. Within this world view, it is intended to make sense of the trials one encounters in everyday life: God has not abandoned us, but is actually working to help us. Taken from 'Break Open the Word'
