Things we do: Continuing my thoughts on what we do during Mass that we perhaps never take notice of. This week: the quiet prayers while offering the gifts of bread and wine.

There are the obvious prayers you hear "Blessed are you Lord God of all creation for through your goodness we this ... bread / wine ... we offer ..." but there are three other prayers that you might not notice.

After the bread is blessed and before the wine there is a moment where I mix a little water with the wine – "By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity." This is a prayer to remind us of the unity of Christ's humanity and divinity; the union of Christ and the Church and the flowing of blood and water from Christ's side after his death on the cross.

After blessing the wine, I quietly say two more prayers: "With humble spirit and contrite heart may we be accepted by you, O Lord, and may our sacrifice in your sight this day be pleasing to you Lord God." And then while I wash my hands "Wash me, O Lord from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin." These prayers are my requests that you, the congregation, and I, the presider, are as open to Jesus' presence as we possibly can be, admitting our sinfulness and need for forgiveness. They also serve to remind me, the presider, that I am not Christ but am standing as Christ in the consecration. Small moments, but important.





REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE TWENTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading

Second Reading

Wisdom 9:13-18

A reading from the book of Wisdom

Who can comprehend the will of God?

In light of the cost of discipleship set out in today's gospel, this reading explains that the human mind cannot grasp God's plan for us. But it is a plan of mercy and forgiveness. As Isaiah wrote: *God's ways are not our ways; as the heavens are high above earth, so are my ways above your ways, my thoughts above your thoughts,* says the Lord (Is 55:8-9).

The 'tent of clay' is a strong poetic image. It speaks of human limitation. Given the difficulty of understanding our own world, what hope do we have of understanding God's will and the ways of heaven? All we can do is stand before God, trusting in divine wisdom and the guidance of the Spirit. This provides a good context for the challenge we are about to hear in the gospel.

Philemon 12-17:Phlm 9-10, 12-17

A reading from the letter of St Paul to Philemon

Receive him, not as a slave anymore, but as a very dear brother.

This is a short and very personal letter of Paul. He writes to Philemon about the runaway slave, Onesimus. Paul had already written to the Galatians that, for those baptised into Christ, there was no longer Jew or Greek, slave or free, male or female – all are one in Christ (Gal 3:28). That is the background to this passage.

Paul is sending Onesimus back to Philemon not as a slave but as a brother in Christ and urges Philemon to accept him as such.

It is, of course, disappointing to the modern mind that the Scriptures do not seem to specifically reject the institution of slavery as such. We need to understand that it was a structural element of society until 19th century (the British Parliament abolished slavery in 1833). Even so, human beings are still enslaved or trafficked in many parts of the world. The message of our oneness in Christ remains a challenge.

Answering the call of Discipleship - Where will it lead us? - What decisions might it demand?

Last month was a big month for Social Justice. It included launch of the 2025-2026 Australian Catholic Bishops Social Justice statement. August also launched publication of the draft of Australia's first formal Treaty agreement among which Victoria's elected Aboriginal body will be given powers to create new institutions. The First Peoples' Assembly says it plans to create a new education facility to boost the skills of Aboriginal people across the state. The Treaty is expected to be signed before the end of this year, These reports and the following will shortly be available on the Parish Website & Notice Board.

Closer to home a St Kevin's Parish SJA Letter was sent to the Australian PM in August supporting the Government's principled position on unacceptable avoidable ongoing Starvation and Malnutrition (in Gaza). That was shared for information with others, including the Local Member for Menzies, and was strongly supported by Catholic Social Services Australia, CSS Victoria, Melbourne Archdiocese Episcopal Vicar, and some other Parishes including Mary Mother of the Church Ivanhoe, which was then prompted to write similarly to the PM. The recently concluded Archbishop's Campaign supports - Priests in retirement; Corpus Christi College; John Pierce Centre for the deaf; Melbourne Overseas Mission, University of Divinity; Catholic community and service organisations, Evangelisation initiatives and Seminarian education. As well, Parishioners support Parish 2nd Collections, and next Newsletter will update feedback. Opportunities abound for responding in various ways to those in need - John Costa SJA
