November: All Souls: Thank you to all those who joined me in blessing the graves of those we love at Templestowe and Eltham Cemeteries as part of our commemoration of the souls of all the faithful departed.

ACYF!!! Australian Catholic Youth Festival: Apparently bookings are full: so 5000 pilgrims from across Australia will attend. An amazing eruption of the Holy Spirit is anticipated 😊 There is much work going on to prepare for the event to ensure a safe and spiritual experience so we keep the pilgrims and organisers in our prayers. And thank you to the additional donors who have added an extra \$1500 to the kitty. We will use the money wisely thank you.

Opportunities coming up:

There are numerous things on the horizon for our parishes.

We have been piloting a way of walking in discipleship with young people. A man in the US, Everett Fritz, started Andrew Ministries as a means of helping show parishes a different way of helping our young people grow into their faith. Small groups with mature people to guide them. A gathering of 5 or so young people with two leasers – each week for maybe 2 hours, from age 13 or so – to help the young people ask the questions and seek the answers THEY need.

We are looking to pilot fellowship groups over the Christmas / New Year. Groups of people gathered together for a meal, faith discussion, fellowship, sharing of challenges and joys, friendship building. We don't have a name for this, though many others do have something along these lines and call them Faith Circles, or Connect Groups, and many other things.

Possibilities for faith formation / bible study / prayer groups / devotionals / adoration, lectio divina ... all sorts of things are possible.

Please let me know, or your PPC members know, what you need for your faith to be nourished and grow and spread.

<u>First Communion:</u> Please pray for our First Communicant's from last weekend. The Masses went well, thanks to children and parents and more than thanks to Ana and Pam, and Dominique and Fulvia who provided the formation of the children and the preparation for the Masses. We pray that this special moment for these children is the start of a lifelong habit for each of these children as they grow and thrive in Christ.

<u>Parish Forum:</u> Please put in your diaries for 2026 that we will be holding a parish forum / assembly / gathering. It'll be about ... where we're at as St Kevin's and where we want to be and ... we don't know yet. Just so you know: expect a date somewhere in May (probably, could be a little earlier if we get our skates on organising).

Remembrance Day is one of the most important days on our Australian Government's commemorative calendar. It's a day when we acknowledge those who died or suffered while serving in wars, conflicts and peace operations. Remembrance Day is held on 11 November each year. This is the anniversary of the Armistice of 1918 that ended fighting in World War I. The war didn't officially end until 28 June 1919 with the Treaty of Versailles. People in Australia and many other countries observe one minute's silence at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month because that's when the Armistice came into effect. It's a time to honour all personnel who died or suffered in the service of Australia.

REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE FEAST THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

First Reading

Ezekiel 47:1-2. 8-9. 12

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

I see water flowing from the temple and all who were touched by it were saved.

The final chapters of Ezekiel present his theological vision of the Temple (which in fact had not yet been rebuilt). It is a vision which carries the symbolism of an ideal relationship between God and the people. Ezekiel's extraordinary poetic imagery proposes a return to the Garden of Eden. He imagines the relationship with God in terms of streams of lifegiving water. This sacred water teams with fish, fruit trees flourish along the bank, and to all it brings healing, health and new life.

It becomes clear that this glorious climax to the book of Ezekiel is not describing a building but lauding the life-giving power of the Creator God whose dwellingplace is the Temple. All creatures are given fullness of life.

With such vivid imagery, this text provides a wonderous proclamation of God's word for the Sunday assembly.

1 Corinthians 3:9-11. 16-17

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

You are the temple of God.

Happily, this text of Paul uses the metaphor of a building to speak of community of the followers of Christ. This is just what we need to hear on the Feast of the Dedication of the Basilica of the Lateran because it celebrates the communion of the Church centred on the pope, the Bishop of Rome. It is also a message which the Church at Corinth needed to hear because of their ongoing competitiveness and rivalry. Today we celebrate a festival of the Christ-centred unity of diverse believers.

Paul sees himself as the architect who laid the foundation of the community and his successors in leadership as the ones who continue the building. Christ is the foundation stone. By the Holy Spirit, God lives in this sacred temple which we are.

For once, this reading from Paul uses a clear metaphor and short sentences.

Brief extracts from Pope Leo's Synodality Presentation to The Jesuits, 24 October 2025 (from americamagazine.org)

"We live in what many describe as a change of epoch, an age marked by rapid shifts in culture, economics, technology and politics. In particular, artificial intelligence and other innovations are reshaping our understanding of work and relationships, and even raising questions about human identity. Ecological degradation threatens our common home. Political systems often fail to respond to the cries of the poor. Populism and ideological polarization deepen divisions within and among nations. Many are affected by consumerism, individualism, and indifference."......"A major frontier today is the path of synodality within the Church. The synodal journey calls all of us to listen more deeply to the Holy Spirit and to one another, so that our structures and ministries may be more agile, more transparent, and more responsive to the Gospel."

Separately, and following Conclusion of the global Synod last October, Pope Francis followed by Pope Leo have made clear that while the concept of Synodality responsive to the Gospel is the way ahead for the Church, its practical implementations across the Church will vary, as does the Church itself in different places. Each of us as People of God will help create our local model of synodality. In 2026 the Melbourne Archdiocese and parishes will formally start to work synodally. So next year each one of us will be invited to contribute to St Kevin's synodal approach "open to new ways of being Church" (a process that has already well begun) - John Costa, Chairperson, SJA
