From the desk of the PP...

Combines Christmas Party: 6 pm this Sunday, in the St Greg's Hall: come along. Hopefully you've booked but even if not yet: email / text me and please, come along. St Greg's and St Kevin's have a wonderful, fun evening planned for all of you.

ACYF!!! Australian Catholic Youth Festival: All went well. Plenty of rain on Sunday got everyone drenched but not deflated. Missing our first choice workshops – a bit of a downer but ... the alternatives were good as well. Surprisingly little time for reflecting on the days during the days. I am in awe of the amount of work and care and love that Jane and Alfred, and Stephanie and Michael, and Alston put in to prepare (and not forgetting the risk assessment which David and Margaret spearheaded and which worked very well).

If I needed a testament to faith in Jesus Christ, it lies in the trust of those five that amidst all the worry and uncertainty and paperwork: this was worth doing. And their efforts meant that the ACYF was an astounding success.

My own experience became dominated by two things. One the absolute enthusiasm of the young and young in heart to praise God and his Holy Name – loudly and frequently and passionately. Two the deep care for their relationship with God which I observed close at hand during the 3½ hours of Confessions I was privileged to hear. Such deep awareness of Jesus and his love and their love for him. I had expected the first; I am deeply humbled by the second.

In addition to my reflection, I have asked for a 20-100 word reflection from each of our pilgrims. Here is the first.

"Hi Father Charles, Here is my reflection of ACYF.

ACYF was an unforgettable experience that allowed me to encounter God in a new way. It helped to put into perspective how there are so many moments in every-day life in which God is present, that I would usually miss or never realise. I particularly enjoyed the plenaries and talks that we went to, though my favourite was Sister Mary Grace's talk on 'How to hear God's voice' which offered advice that I can use. Finally, I found that I have learnt so much about my faith and the sacraments (especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation) that I will hold for the rest of my life, and I even experienced worship music for the first time! Thank you for taking us to ACYF and for paying for dinner- I had such a good time. Kind Regards, ..."

2026 Assembly: After discussions in the most recent St Kevin's and St Greg's Parish Council Meetings we have decided to hold a joint-parishes assembly in May 2026. The primary intent will be to discuss how we follow Pope Francis and now Pope Leo in being a synodal church. More information in early February.

Sanctuary Modification: You can see some drawings in the gathering space showing some detailed thinking about how we might modify the Sanctuary. There are two purposes: one to enhance the sense of being around the table with Jesus and one to enhance visibility for everyone (compared to how we are currently using the small altar).

Please give us, me your thoughts. The Liturgy Group and Parish Pastoral Council have discussed this and agree the change would be God bless, Fr Charles worthwhile.

REFLECTIONS ON THE READINGS OF THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading

Second Reading

<u>Isaiah 11:1-10</u>

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

He judges the poor with justice.

The house of David is like a tree stump. But the burnt-out stump produces a new shoot and thus begins a glorious future. This is Isaiah's vision of hope and consolation.

The Spirit of the Lord rests upon the new leader. Here we have a listing of the gifts of the Spirit – a list used to the present day, for example, in the Confirmation prayer. The Spirit enables the leader to rule with justice and integrity.

And by the power of the Spirit, the leader inaugurates a glorious, idyllic kingdom of harmony and peace. All creation is restored to its original goodness. As described in the poetic and evocative litany, this fantastic concord is wildly improbable. Yet it articulates a dream for a better future.

At the beginning, we hear of the gifts of the Spirit with solemn deliberation. But in the second half, we take delight in the playful images of the new creation. Let us smile and be amazed as the lines unfold.

Romans 15:4-9

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Christ, the hope of all people.

Paul reminds the Romans that the Scriptures contain many stories of believers who did not give up and who were helped by God. This is a source of hope for us all. If we stick at it, being tolerant with each other after the example of Christ himself, then by our very lives we give glory to God.

Patience and persistence are good Advent virtues. They point to that conversion of heart to which John the Baptist calls us in the gospel. They lead to a unity of mind and voice so that we can in fact join Christ and his Body, the Church, in praising God.

Cry of the Poor and Cry of the Earth

(The following text is extracted from Advent of Hope and Ecological Conversion, Greg Lopez, Cardijn Community of Australia, 1 December 2025)

"Advent is a season of hope, waiting, and conversion. It prepares us to celebrate Christ's first coming at Christmas and deepens our longing for his return. Pope Francis calls us to hear both "the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor" and to live an integral ecology—holding people and planet together in our moral decisions. In Laudate Deum, he warns that our responses remain inadequate and urges a rapid transition away from destructive patterns, with commitments that are effective, monitored, and shared."

(This is one of a set of Cardijn Community Advent Reflections, and integrates) "Scripture, the See–Judge–Act method that Joseph Cardijn* gifted to lay movements, and practical prompts for prayerful action—so that our Advent faith becomes visible in our homes, parishes, workplaces, and streets." It's a useful reminder that care for people and social justice as part of our faith needs to be linked to care for the land and environment, particularly as rapidly growing populations and visible climate changes compete with the Earth for survival' *Joseph Cardijn was a Belgian Catholic Cardinal, founder of the movement of Young Christian Workers (WCW), with a lifetime dedication to social activism. - John Costa SJA
