Fr Charles.

Report to Parish Pastoral Council Meeting, 4 December 2025

1. Brigidine Asylum Seeker project (BASP)

We periodically attend updates on Australian Refuge and Asylum Seeker data and legal/political issues/developments, facilitated by BASP. Last month was by the Refugee Council of Australia. They further reported that Australia now marks the significant milestone of 1 million well-assimilated refugees since WW2. Sr Brigid Arthur told me afterwards she is highly impressed with the understanding, interest and active engagement on refugee issues by the many Catholic Secondary School Students who actively participate in various BASP programs.

2. Managing ad hoc approaches to Parishes from people outside our Parishes or otherwise seeking or validly warranting (limited) urgent financial aid.

As canvassed at a previous PPC Meeting, SJA (Carmel Purdey) arranged two meetings with representatives of St Kevin's and St Gregory's (including from there the Vinnies Doncaster & Box Hill Conference President Gerard O'Donnell) to consider the situation and options. We also considered how some other nearby Parishes address this very real issue. Drawing from all this, an informal collaborative approach was found to be helpful, including validity assessment of external approaches by Vinnies data and processes. It was agreed that a carefully managed and audited joint Parish fund be established for such purposes, supported by some Parish fundraising, and that SJA would reinstate one 2nd Collection each year towards this need, and that outcomes would be closely observed and reviewed.

3. 2nd Collections

While awaiting a draft CAM 2026 Collections/Observance schedule we're starting to draft our 2026 2nd Collection Schedule, which as always will be widely canvassed before seeking PPC endorsement. This year we have only needed 3 Schedule Revisions, compared to around 7 last year.

4. Ongoing Routine SJA visit activity

Currently we regularly visiting 6 persons with special needs. This might appear routine but is far from so in particular situations. Just one recent case alone illustrates this with the third need to call an ambulance over a short period, with two prior serious events involving hospitalisation. On this occasion an elderly large/heavy person insisting on remaining home despite ill health and already briefly visited 5 days weekly by a government subsidised health service slipped and fell after emerging from a shower. Though luckily uninjured he was unable to get up alone without specialised lifting. On another occasion his emergency alarm went off around midnight requiring an immediate personal check by myself, though a false alarm.

5. Website SJA previously reported to PPC on our comprehensive establishment of a network of suitable external websites to promote particular SJA events. We are now looking at ways to increase parish-website utilisation by our own parishioners for SJA purposes.
